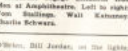

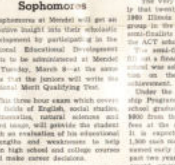

# Mendel Graduate Describes Life at Tolentine

It goes like this: "Fr. LaFont, O.S.A., seems to be saying to Regis as he performs an experiment in organic distillation. Regis, a chemistry major, spends several hours a week in Tolentine's modern, well-equipped chemistry lab.



Where does an Augustinian come from? Does he hatch, or just suddenly appear? I don't care to reveal my past life, but I can tell you that just a few years ago I was standing in the same shoes figuratively speaking that you are prounding up and down the halls of Mendel. And now I'm prounding up and down the halls of Tolentine. You already know what goes on at Mendel, so here's a brief rundown on what goes on at Tolentine.

First, just what runs up and down the halls? Seminarians. And what kind of creatures are seminarians? Well, seminarians are the men who would be priests, doctors, policemen, lawyers, ball players, or military engineers had not God chosen otherwise. Look around at any classmate. Notice all the different types? The same goes here, except that we've all got the same goal—the priesthood.

Now let's run through a day in the life of a seminarian—me. You'll notice my smiling face (maybe not always smiling because one has to be serious sometimes) in the pictures which accompany this article. They were taken by the "Mendelian" staff on Thursday. Here's how that day went. It started with a bell at five-twenty-five. Twenty minutes later I was down in chapel for the first of the Divine Office. Since the Office takes about two hours in all, we don't say it all at once. It's broken up into three divisions: the first says it assembe before breakfast, before dinner, and before supper. At eight-forty-five I slipped into my place for the first class, philosophy, and slouched down so the professor wouldn't call on me. English and Spanish followed with five minute intervals. By the way, in my Junior year now I just before dinner, I was told to report with the other Mendel Alumni to the front office to be interviewed by the "Mendelian" staff. I know from last year they wanted one of us to write an article, and I hate work, so I tried to arrive a little late; but my timing was awful, so you can see why this article. And don't think that we don't get a workout. Sports in a seminary are brutal affairs. It's surprising how few who look so holy in habits like myself, can be absolute mummies on the playing field. I found out the hard way, by losing a few. It's every man for himself. We do try to take it easy, though, in the sense that we haven't had the opportunity of building up their muscles in the corridors of Mendel during the afternoon stampede for the C. T. A.

The recreation period ended at five, and everyone had a chance to clean up their room. Then came the study period. Supper came at six, and we had a short study period and the seven o'clock study period. After supper, Ag comes—last two and a half hours—study period.

Ag sometimes it seems too long. Anyway, the study period at nine-thirty. During this time we have a sports page, listen to the radio, gather up Ag. At a quarter to ten the silence bell rings. After the silence bell rings, we have a short study period. It's the day after, and I curl up in the bed for the night.

## WHAT'S LIKE?

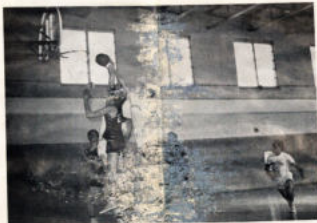

# Mass of Thanksgiving said at New Minor Seminary

## COMPLEX NAMED HICKEY HALL

A decade and a half have passed since the Augustinian Fathers of the Midwest Province purchased the 100 acres now vividly situated on the eastern shore of Lake Michigan just north of Chicago. On the west, a road and a quarter-mile sandy beach border the area which is spiced with areas of virgin forest. This picturesque setting is central to the north, south, east and west of the Augustinian Minor Seminary.

Like a diamond in the setting, a new million and a half dollar complex has been erected here to accommodate the growing needs of the Province. The newer building will be used as a House of Formation for the Augustinian Brothers who have had a phenomenal increase in numbers over the past six years.

The new building is known as Hickey Hall in honor of the first American Father General of the Order, the Most Rev. Joseph Huber, O.S.A. The exterior will feature fine, clean-lined and conventional architecture, providing simple dignity and a faculty residence with recreational facilities.
