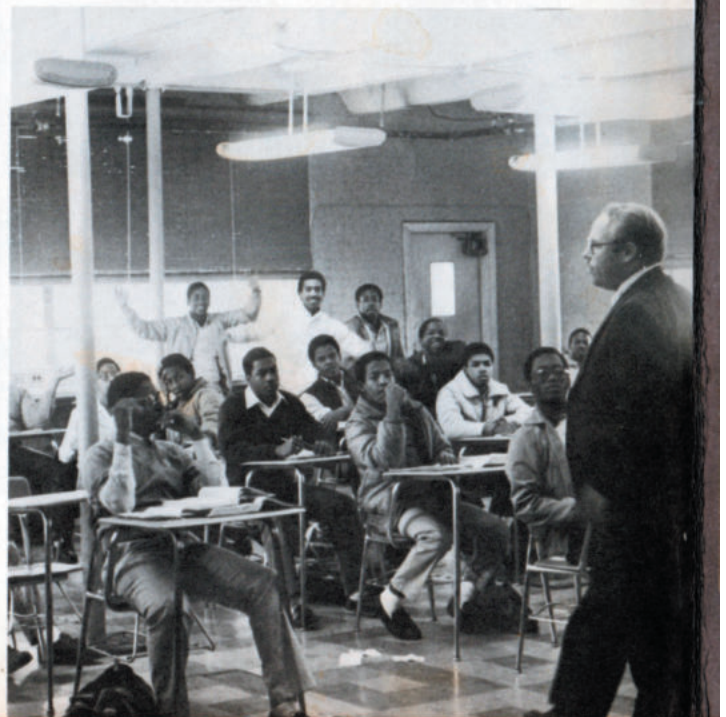

The Augustinians founded Mendel Catholic Preparatory High School in 1951 and the Monastery of Blessed Stephen Bellesini in 1956. This Order traces its roots to St. Augustine in North Africa about the year 400. Legally it has been sanctioned as an Order by Rome since 1256. The school and the Monastery are the sole property of the Province of our Mother of Good Counsel. The Community at Mendel has been delegated through the leadership of the Principal to operate the school and all its services.

I wish you God's blessing and success in all that you undertake.

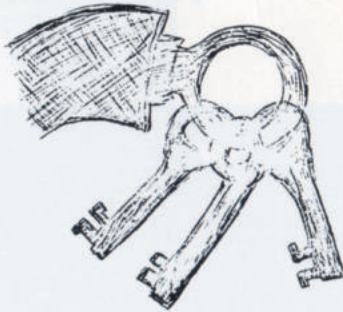

The keys behind Mendel's success are the parents, administration, faculty, and most of all the students themselves, namely the Seniors.

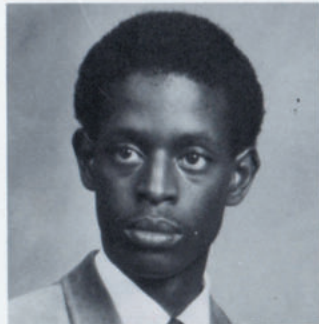

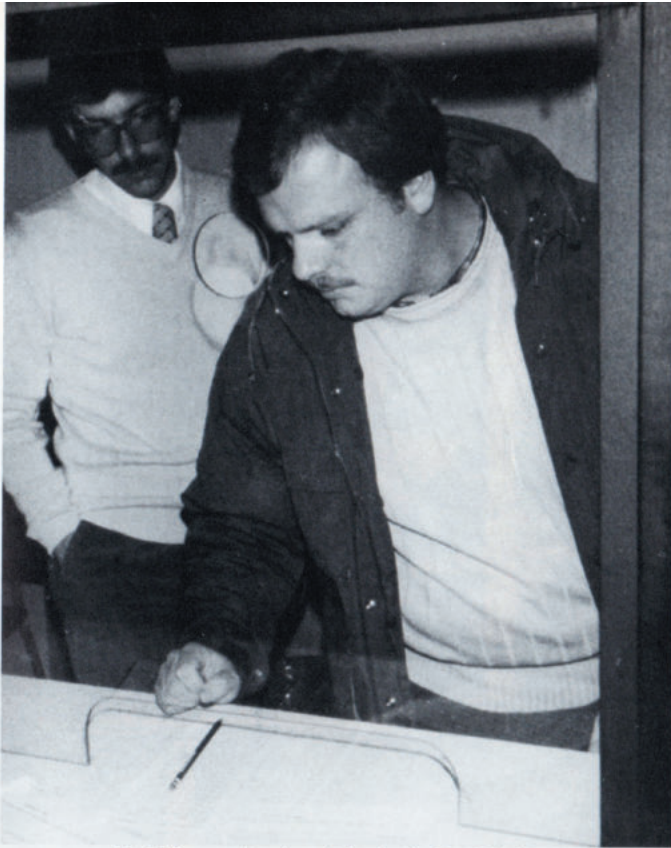

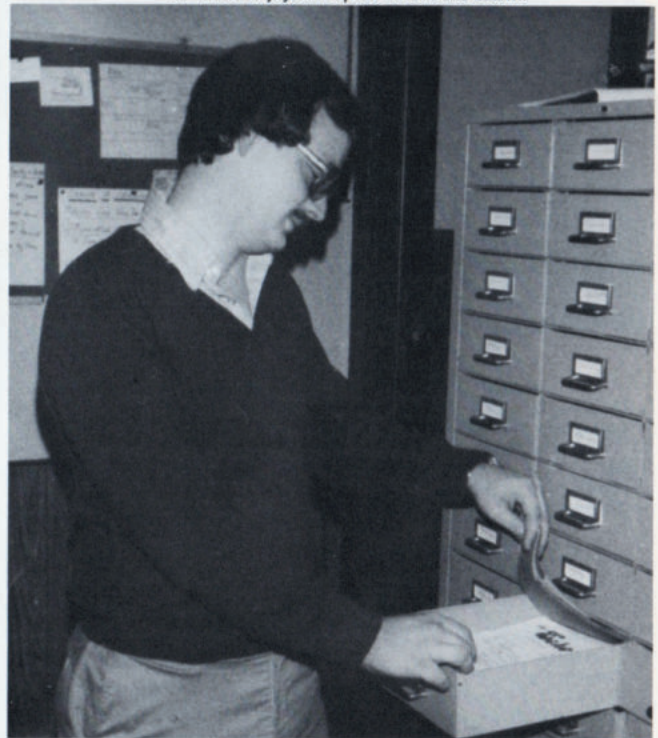

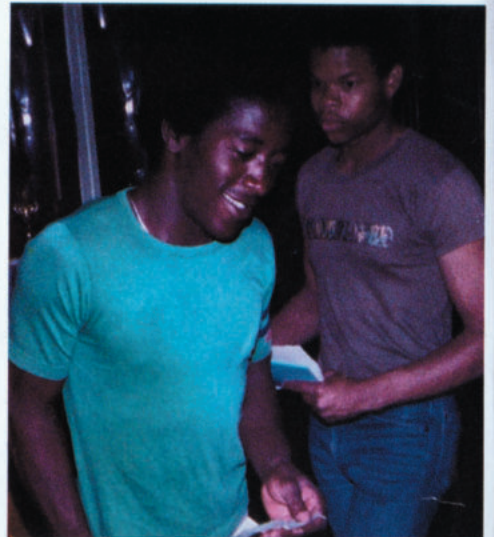
Key elements in the student's life are his parents. Therefore, each year a Mini-Schedule is conducted by the Department of Studies in conjunction with the Parents' Club.

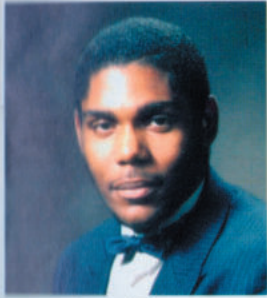
Its purpose is to familiarize the parents with their son's environment during his school day, not only the place, but also his teachers and programs.

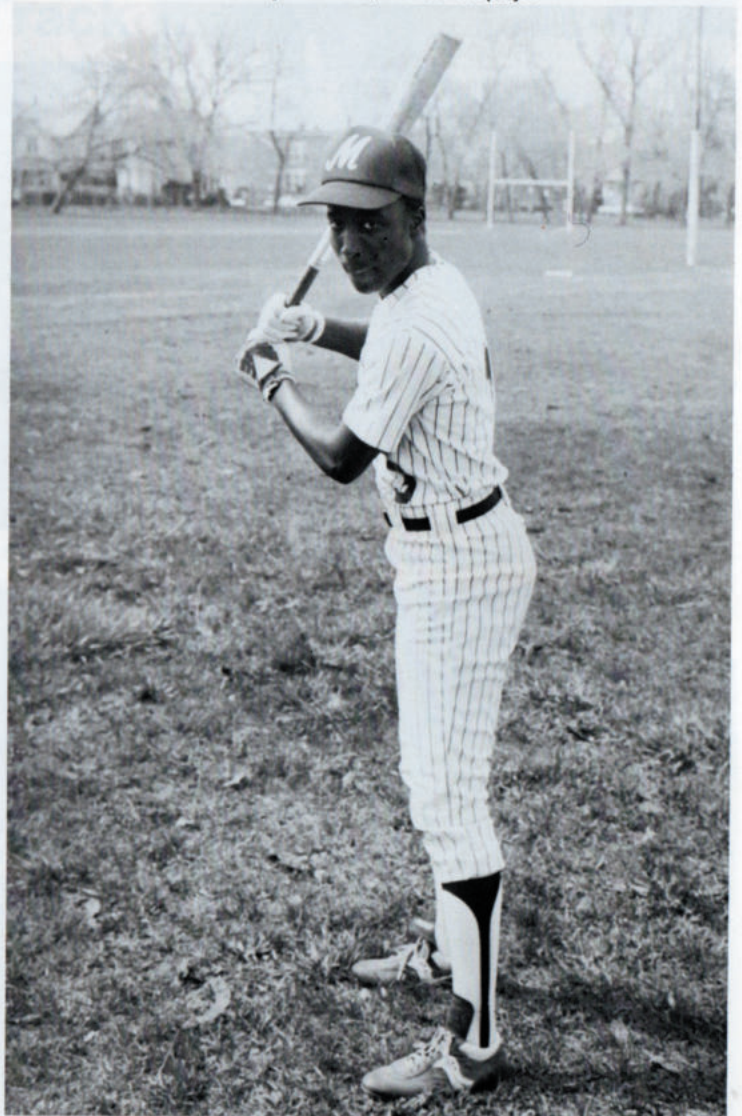

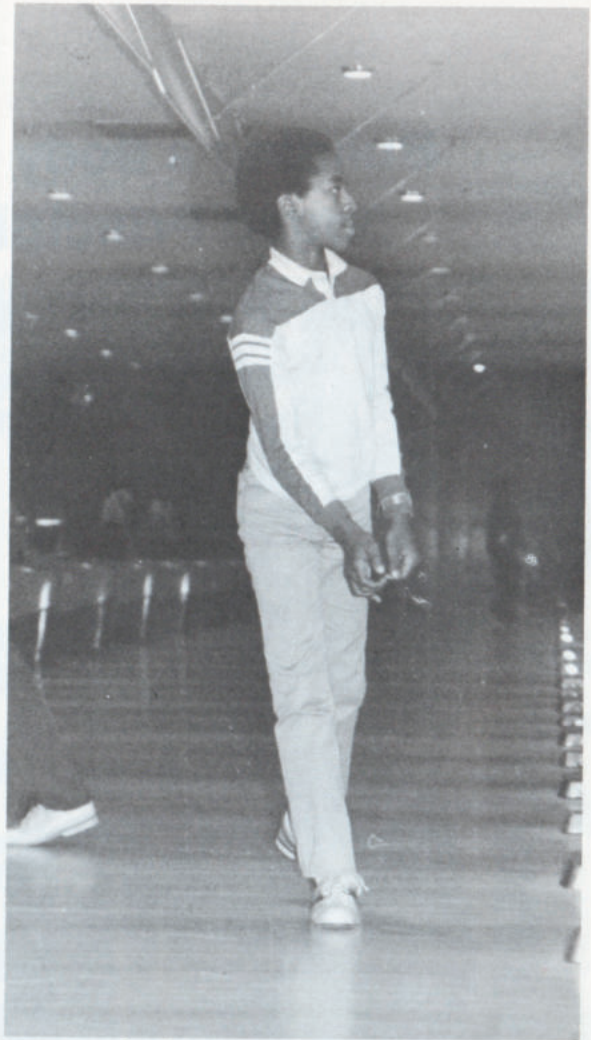

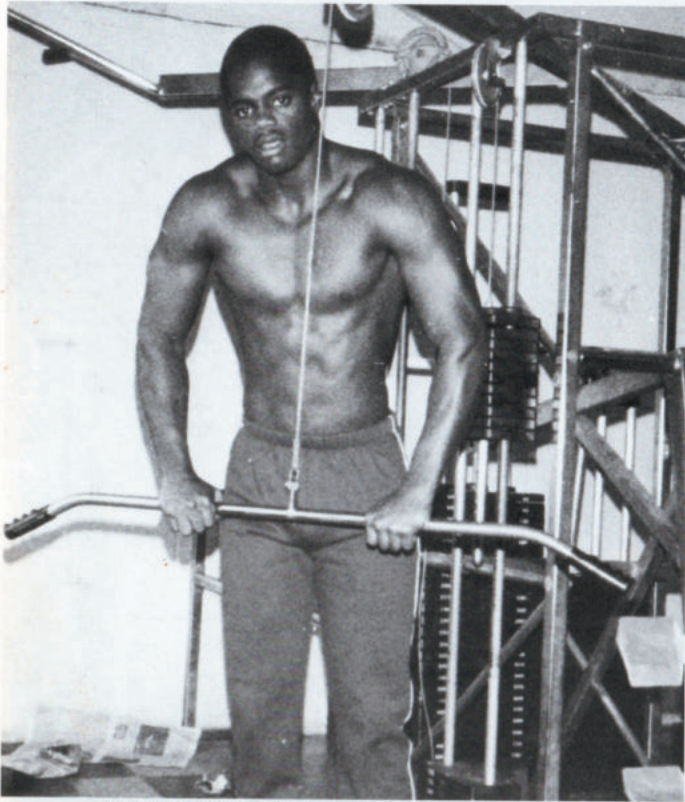

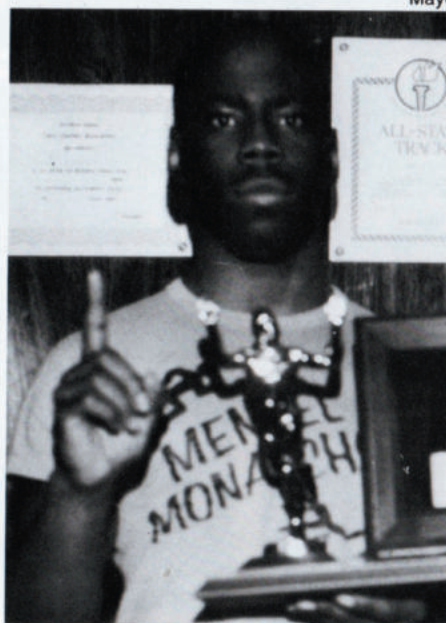
