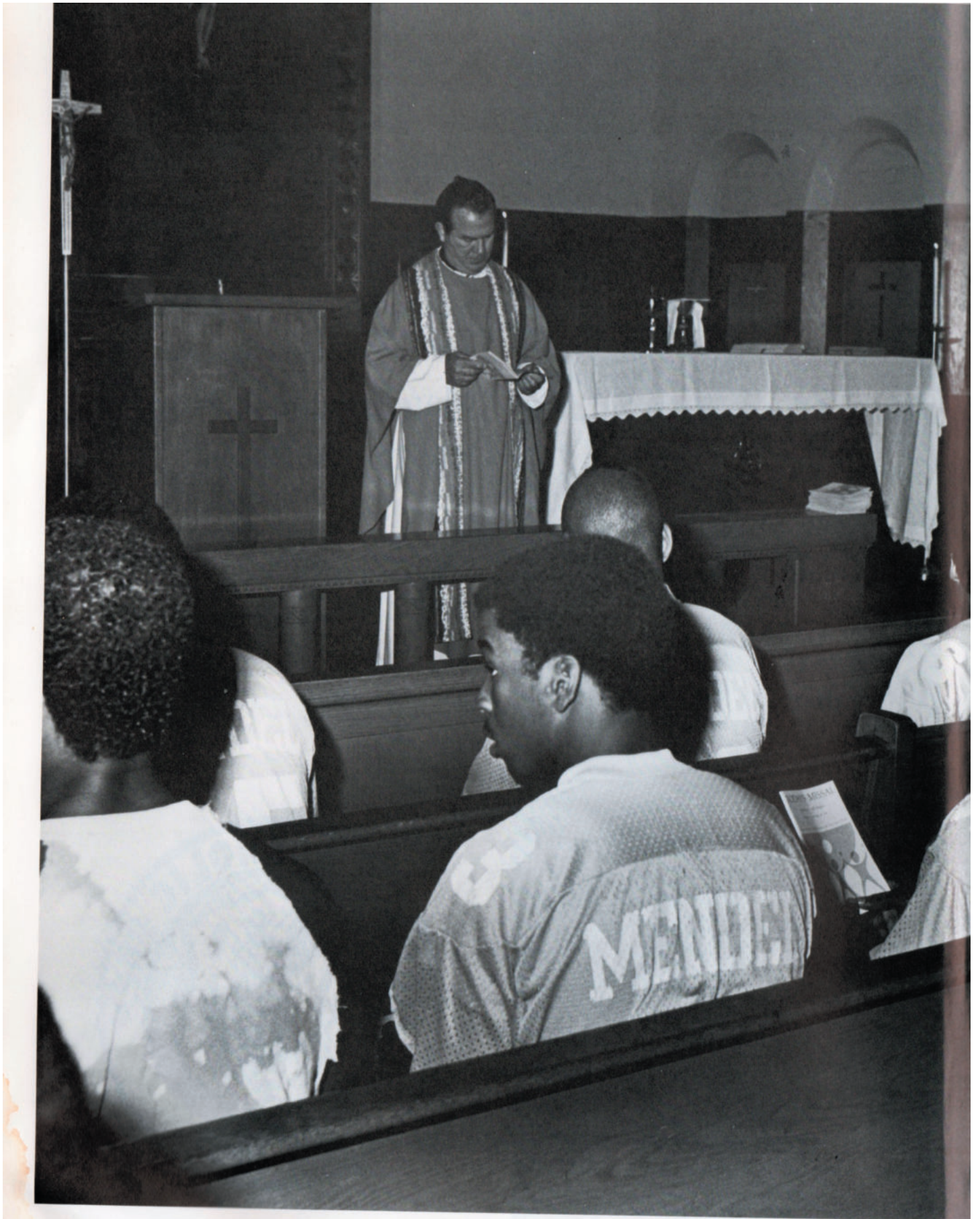

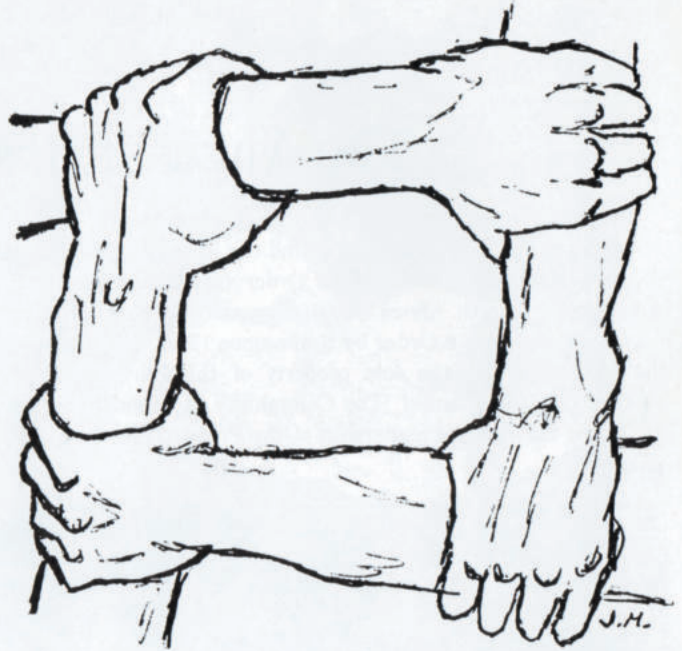
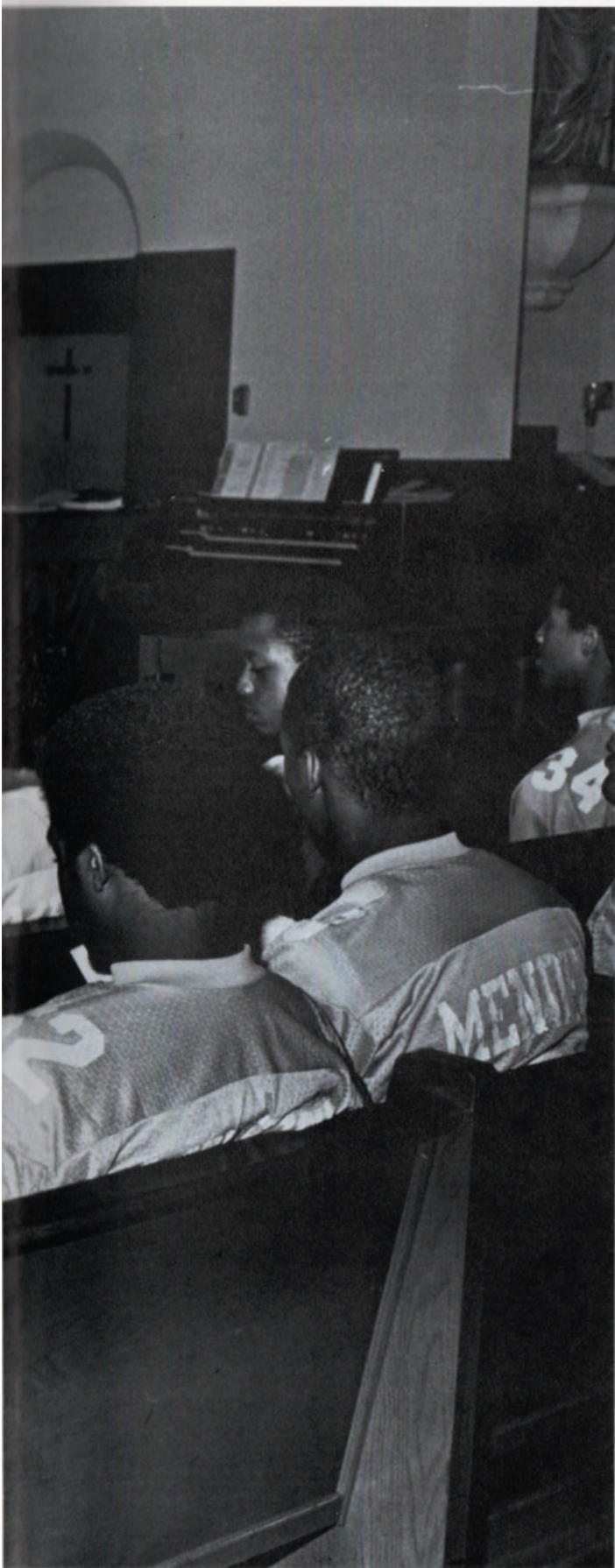

This Order traces its roots to St. Augustine in North Africa about the year 400. Legally, it has been sanctioned as an Order by Rome since 1256. 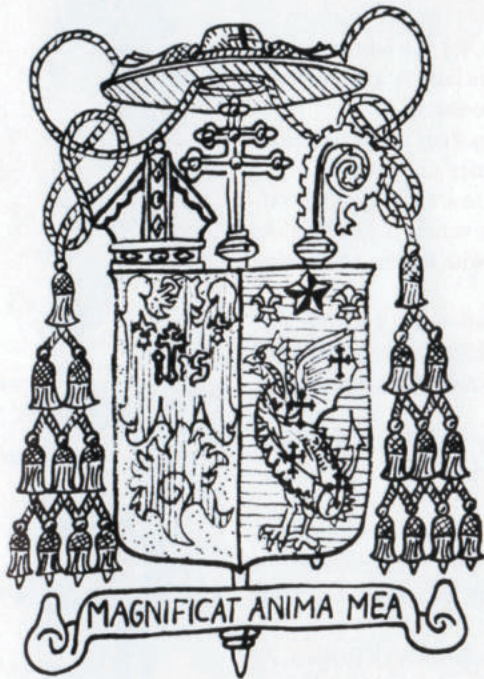

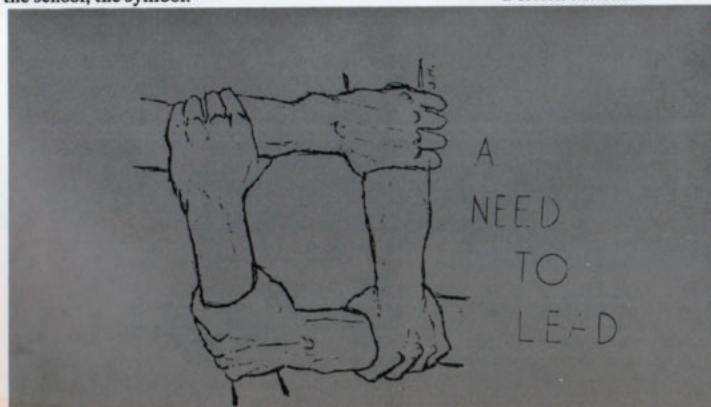

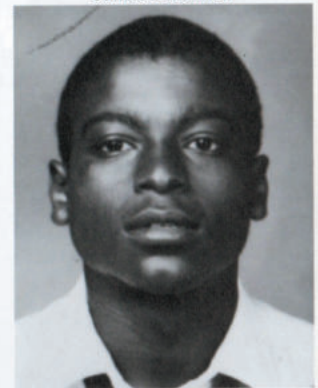
As we continued our climb up the ladder as juniors, we found ourselves *determined* to keep striving to reach the last step in high school.

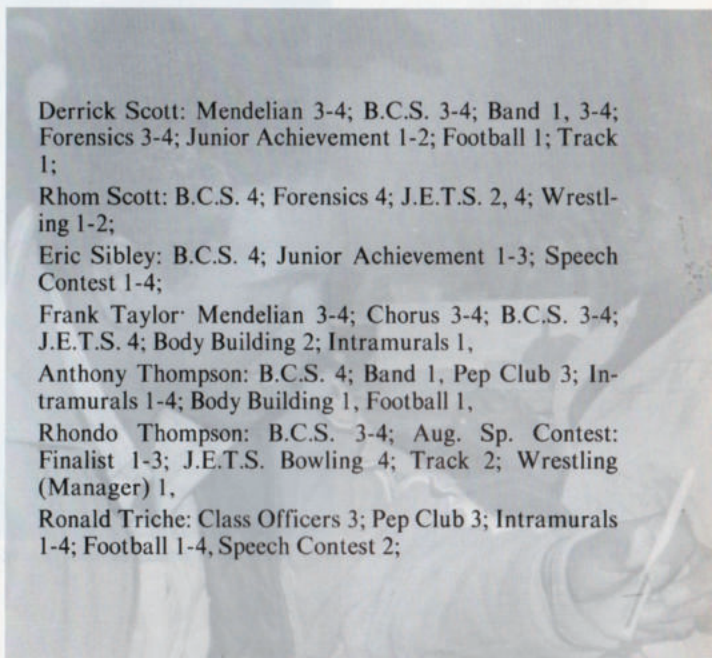

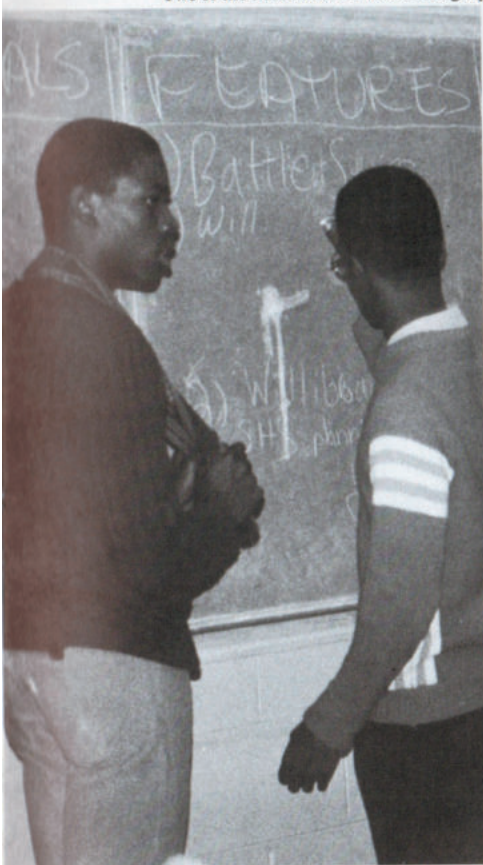

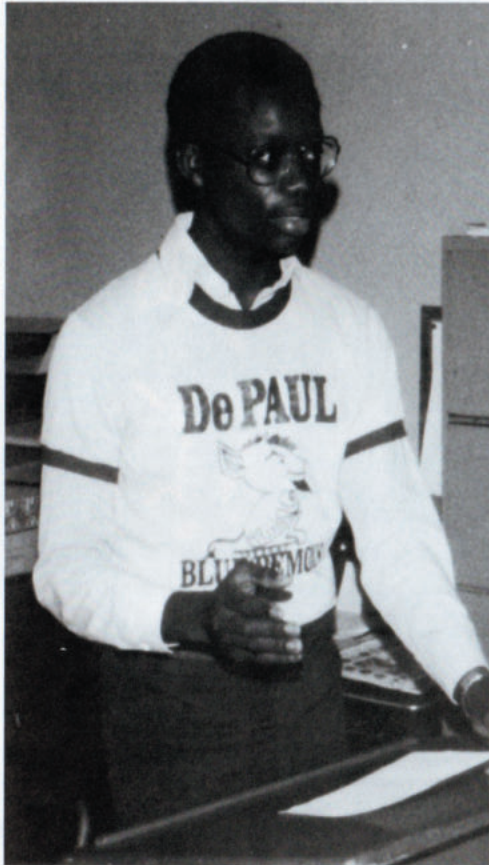

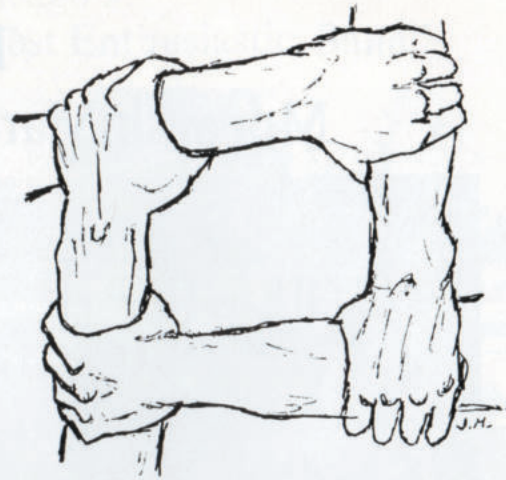

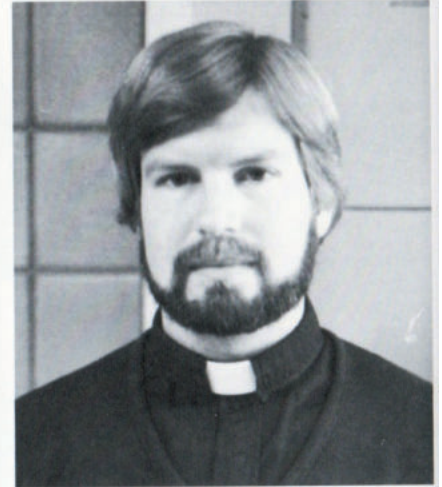

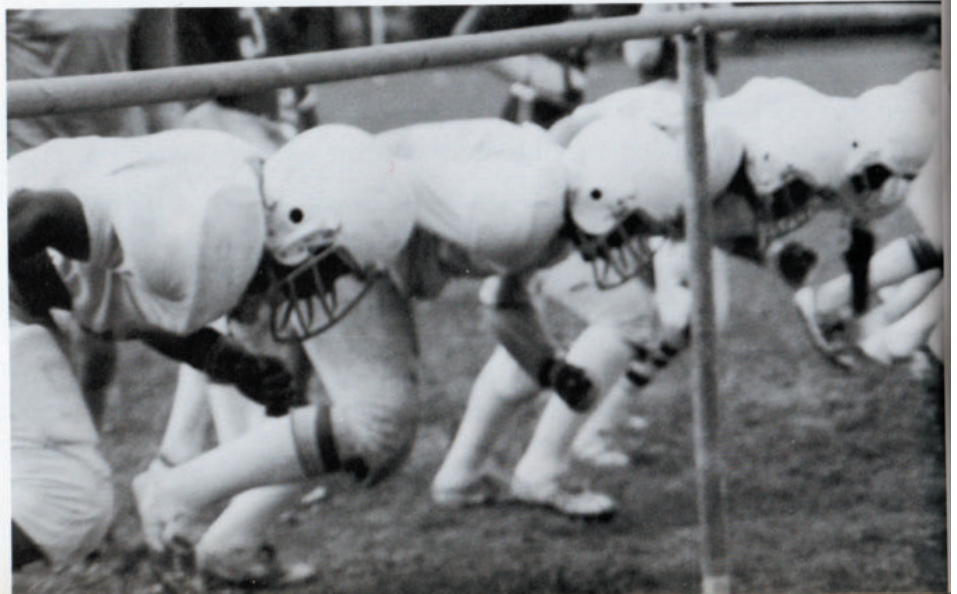

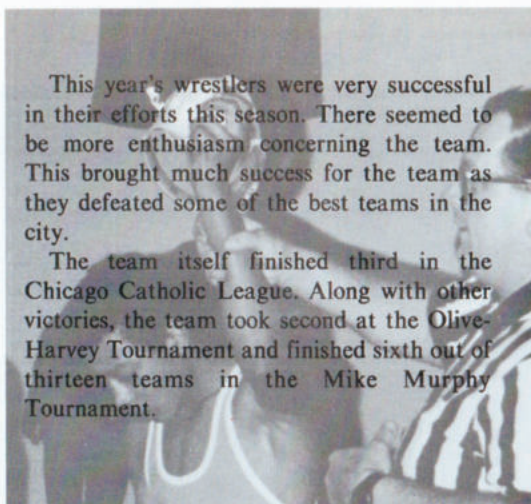

The 1981 Outdoor Track season was quite prosperous for the Monarchs. At the Outdoor Catholic League Championships Mendel placed 4th, while the Frosh-Soph Team was Second. Varsity athletes from Mendel who placed are as follows: S. Tyson (11), 4th in the high jump; Brian Spooner (10), 5th in the Long Jump; J. McGriff, SETTING A NEW CATHOLIC LEAGUE RECORD, 1st in the 100m dash, as well as 3rd in the 200m dash; S. Tyson (10) 2nd in the 100m dash.

Mendel also had two first places in the relay categories: 400m and 800m, as well as two fourth places in the 3200m and 1600m.

In the 1981 Frosh-Soph Championships the team did even better. The Mendel places are as follows: S. Tyson (10), first in both the 100m and 200m dashes; T. Crawford (9), 4th in the 400m dash; T. Wesley (10) 2nd in the 1600m run and 4th in the 3200m run; Thomas (10), 3rd in the 300m low



hurdles; D. Aiken (10), 2nd in the shot put; S. Tyson (10), 1st in the long jump; B. Jensen (10), 1st in the triple jump; F. (10), 4th in the triple jump; Cy Finner (10), 2nd in the high jump, 5th in the long jump, and 5th in the triple jump.

The frosh-soph had two first place relays in the 400 (league record of 44.3) and 800 (league record of 1:13.5), as well as a 2nd in the 1600m and 4th in the 3200m.

At the IHSA District Meet, Mendel placed sixth with 18 points. Of these members, two qualified (but did not place) in the State Meet in the 400m relay (Spooner, Fields, Thomas, and Hall); and C. Dunn in the low hurdles. Jimmy McGriff placed fourth in the 100m dash and fourth in the 200m dash. Jimmy is currently tied for First Place for the IHSA 200m dash of 27:6 (done in semi-finals). Overall Mendel ranked 19th in the State competition.

We would like to thank the various teams, organizations, and individual students with their coaches, moderators, and advisors for cooperation and patience.

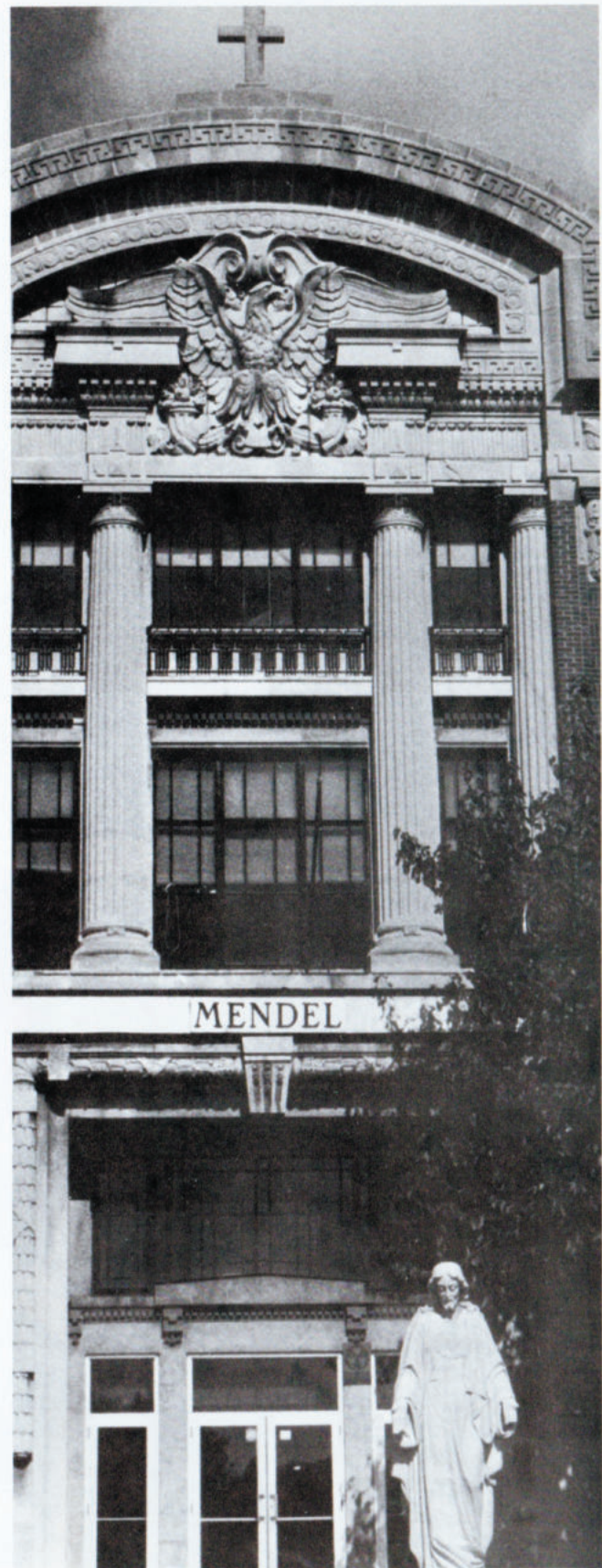
