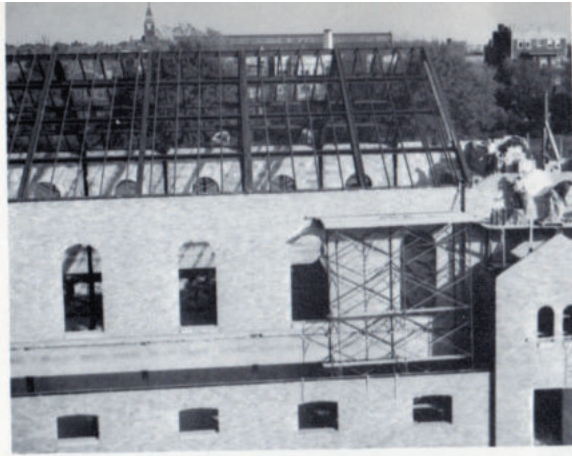
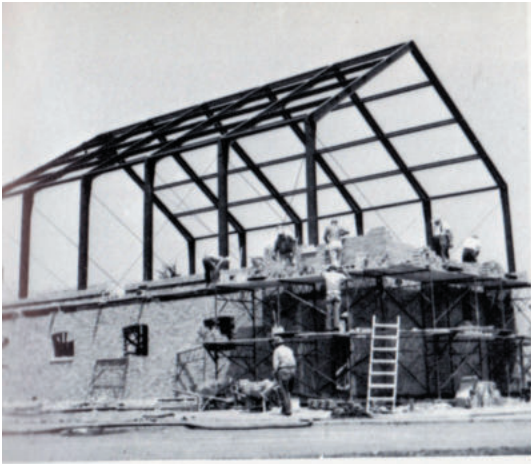


He Saw . . .

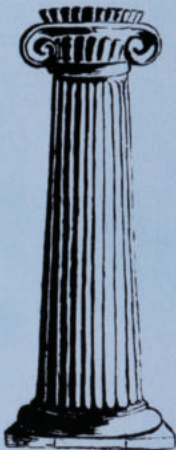
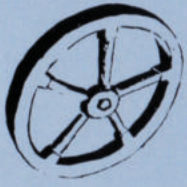

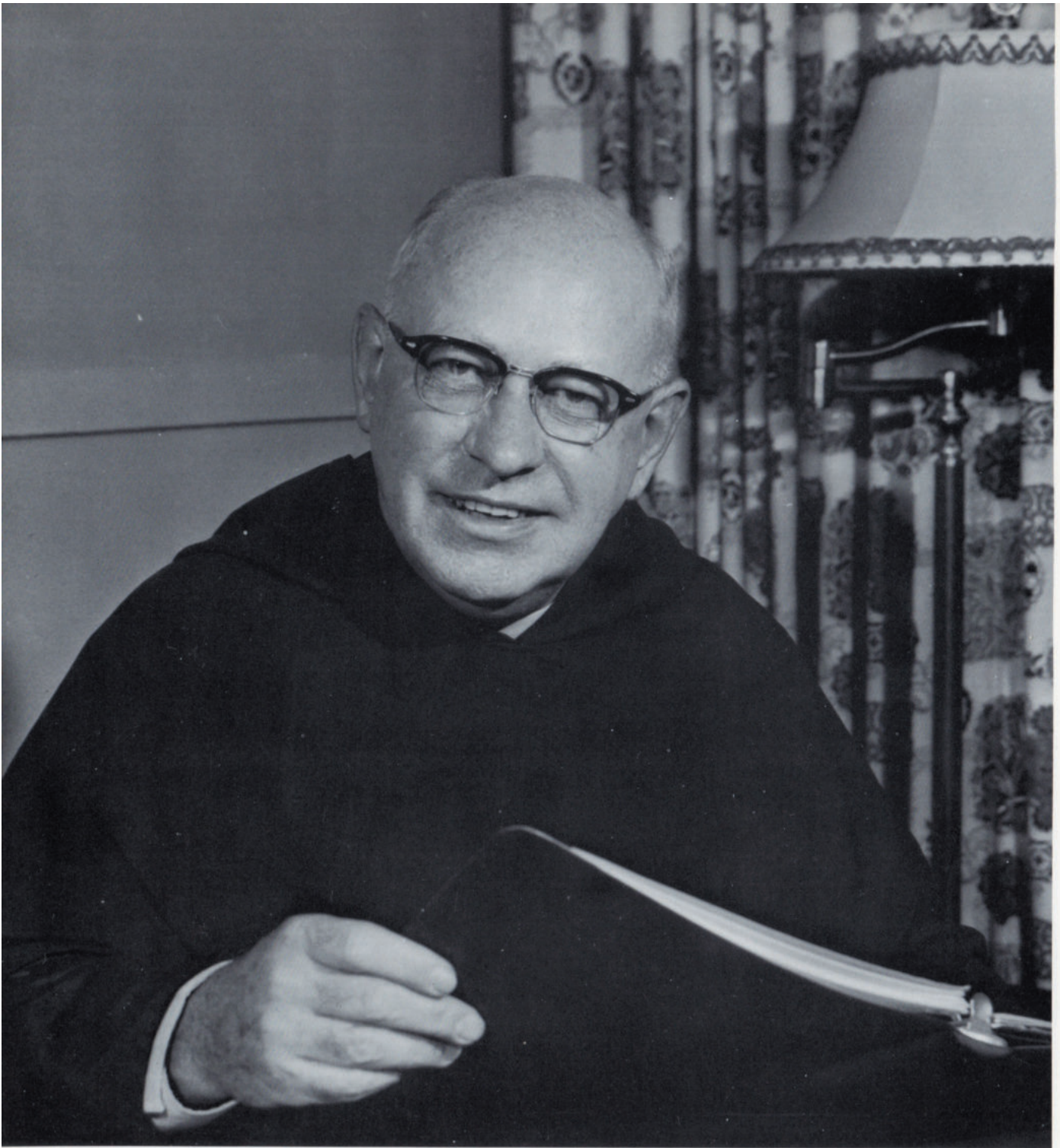

Dedication

Ten years time has made the difference between desolate thin prospects and progressive far-sightedness. To the two men who stamped out Mendel's metal in its first years, the Monarch is appropriately dedicated . . . to the Very Rev. John L. Seary, O. S. A., and to Rev. Francis X. Cavanaugh, O. S. A. . . . since "all good history must include a knowledge of the men who transformed mere circumstances into human experience" . . . the human experience which is met in a school of Mendel's cut and mettle, is a merit and asset to a young man's life.



The First Rector

The Very Rev. John L. Seary, O.S.A., headed the venture that is Mendel when its history first began in the fall of 1951. Other firsts and first places, he has held, administered and loved have been the rector's post in Rockford, Illinois; as First Prior of St. Monica's Seminary, Holland, Michigan; Headmaster of Cascia

Hall, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and Provincial of the Augustinian Province of Our Mother of Good Counsel. Perhaps in none does he place more stock and feeling than the Mendel he helped to found. With good reason, then, the Monarch chooses to cite Father's labor in behalf of Mendel as befits a priest and educator.



The Second Rector

Mendel's sprint down its second mile of history took impetus from the organizing efforts of Rev. Francis X. Cavanaugh, O.S.A. His background in the Augustinian education field is impressive: Bachelor of Arts, Villanova University; Bachelor of Science in Education, Villanova, where for a time he was a professor; Vice-

Rector of Cascia Hall, Tulsa; Vice-Rector of St. Rita, 1952—1956; Rector of Mendel, 1956—1959 and presently prior of Austin High, Detroit. Well known are Fr. Cavanaugh's efforts in sharpening to keen edge Mendel's system of academic achievement. The Monarch now acknowledges his contribution in this twin dedication.

Before taking his place in the forming of Mendel's history, Father has, since his ordination, been actively engaged in Augustinian educative enterprises. After finishing his graduate work at the Catholic University of America toward a Master's Degree in Sociology, Father was assigned to St. Rita High School, in Chicago. He next was appointed to the first faculty upon the founding of St. Monica Seminary in Oconomowoc, Wisconsin. By Provincial appointment, he was assigned for a three year term as Procurator of Cascia Hall, Tulsa, Oklahoma. And for the next twelve years he acted in the capacity of Prefect of Studies and Assistant Headmaster at Cascia Hall. Since 1959 he has held the office of Rector at Mendel. Under his capable and experienced leadership, Mendel has continued to advance in its contribution for the education of Catholic youth.

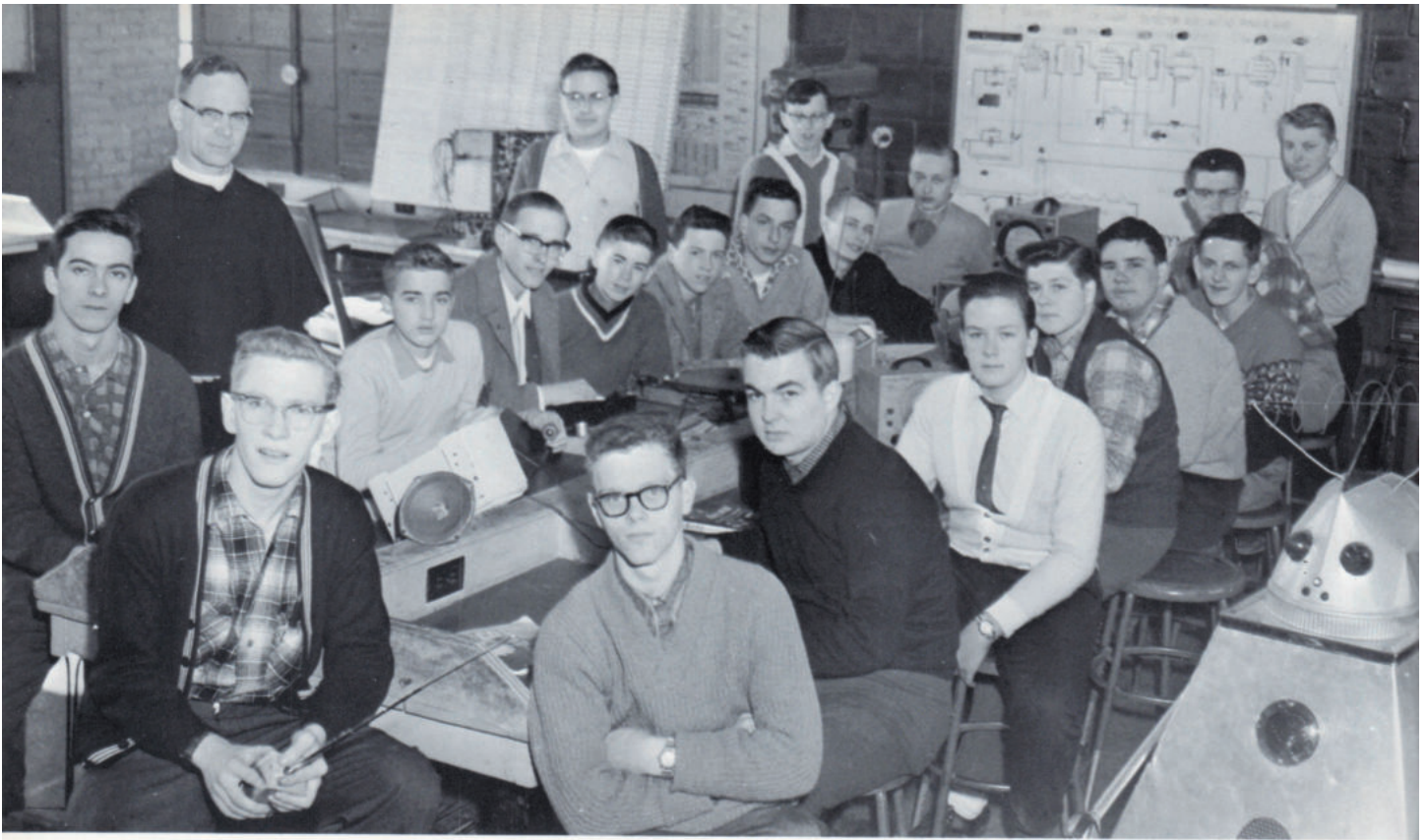

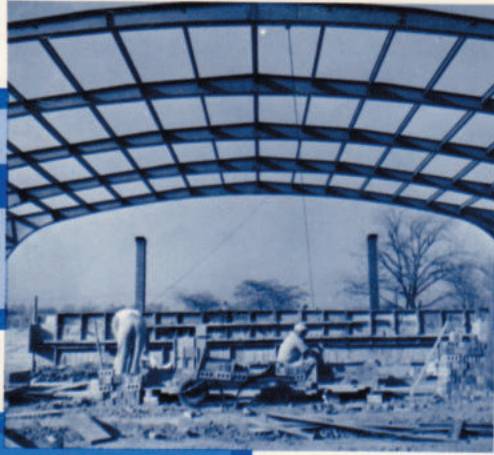

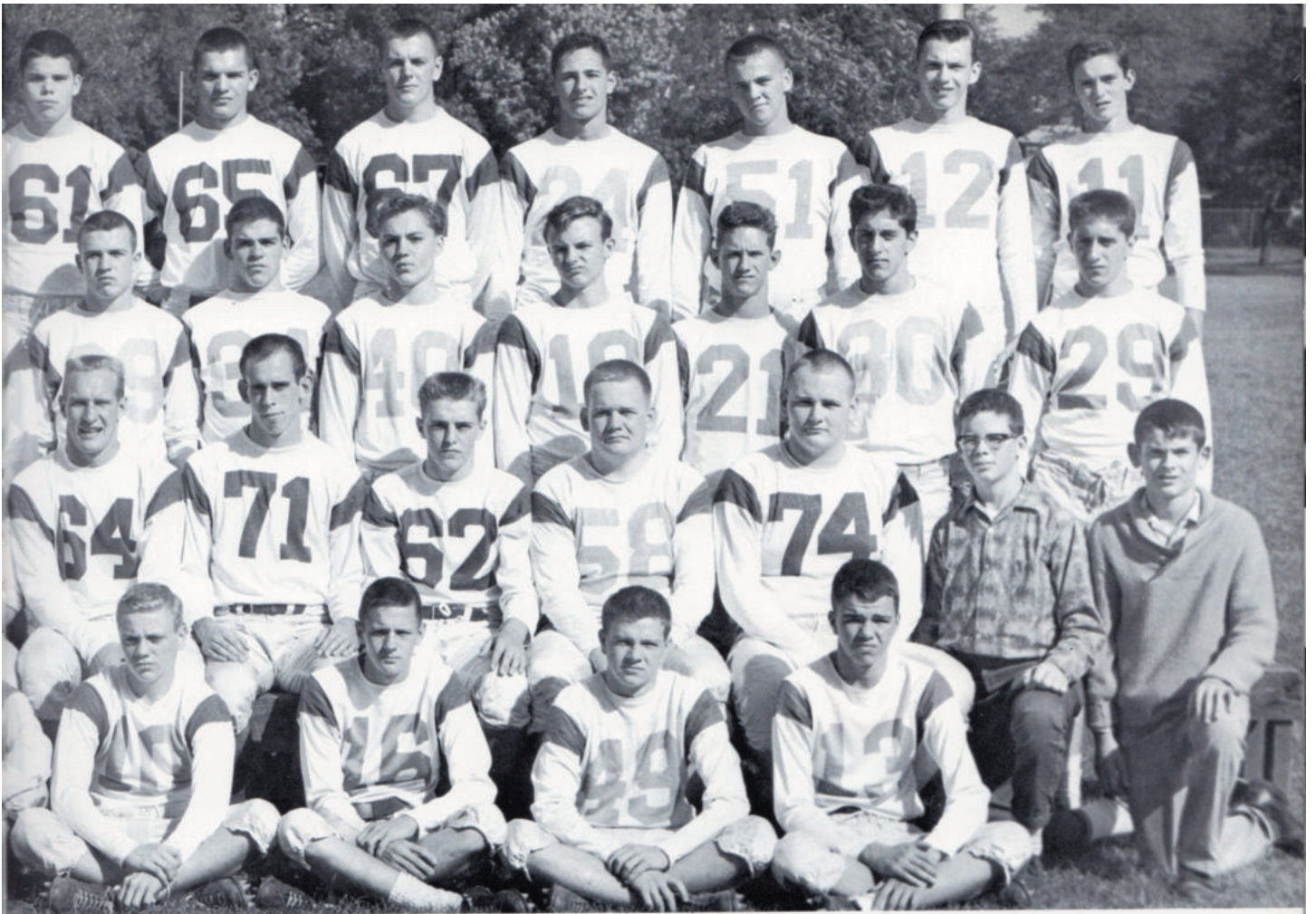

Gerald Brand sits beside his device for gaging nuclear magnetic resonance.



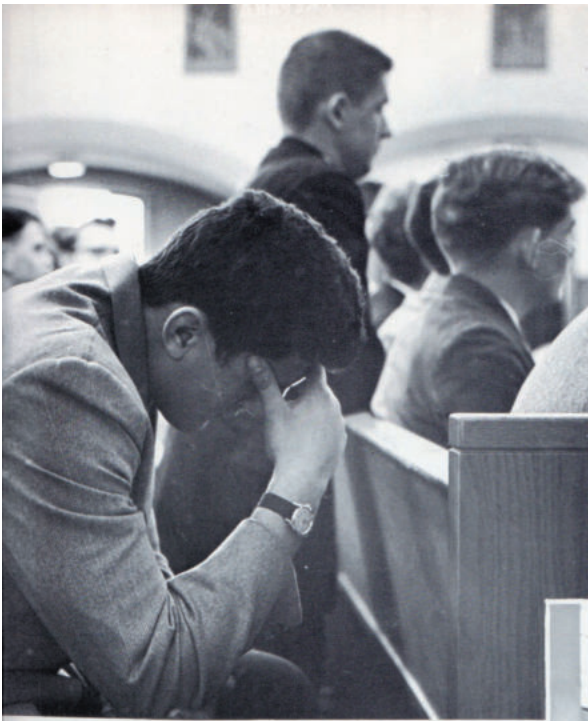

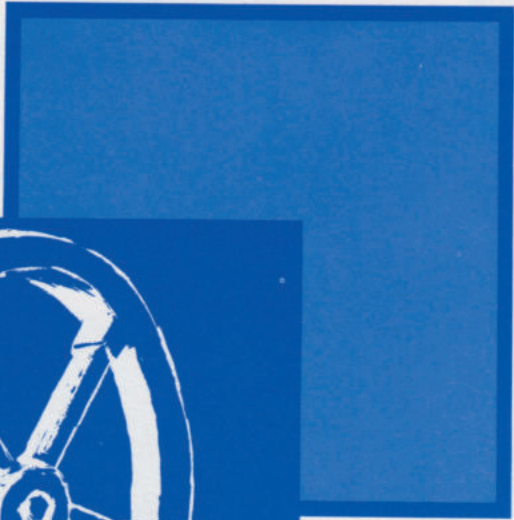
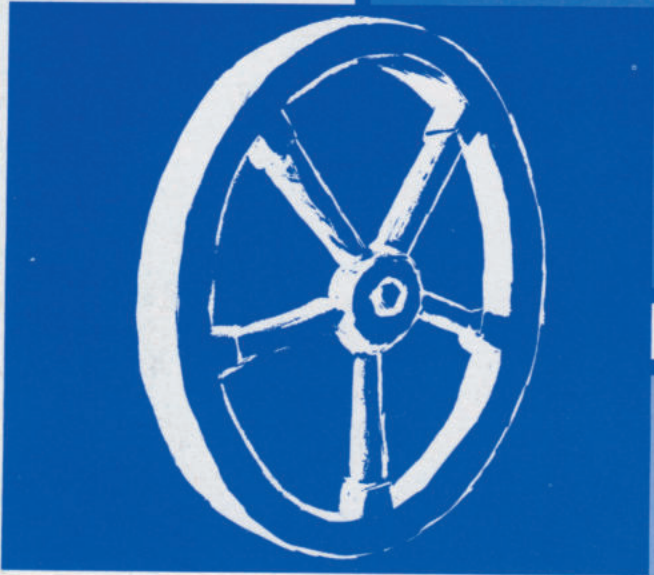
Father Winn's life was marked with three milestones. The first was his birth in Lawrence, Massachusetts, on March 18, 1906. The second was his ordination on June 11, 1935, in the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C. The third was his death on April 24, 1962, at Mendel.

Half of Mendel's history as a school had been fathered under Father Winn during his six years as Prior for three of which he was also Procurator. While stationed for fourteen years at Cascia Hall in Tulsa, Oklahoma, he was likewise Procurator and Prefect of Discipline. From 1950 to 1953 he was procurator of St. Rita High School. In 1953 Father was made Procurator of St. Mary's Church, Rockford, Illinois, and in 1956 took up the double post of Procurator and Prior of Mendel Catholic High School.

When Father Winn passed the last milestone left in the life of a priest, he had only to receive what rewards were his from the Eternal High Priest, Jesus Christ.

"Therefore, we must pray at all times for the souls of the departed, for thus shall we be charitable, thus shall we be kind and merciful, thus shall we ourselves escape an unhappy death." XLIV Sermon of St. Augustine to the Brethren in the desert.
