






#### Football




next season.












## Wrestling

Mendel's varsity wrestlers, led by co-captains Pat Taff and Randy Pettenon, showed once again their strength and depth as they posted a respectable 8-2 record in Catholic league play. The Monarchs, after chalking up 2 consecutive wins in match play against Mt. Carmel and St. Lawrence recorded their only loss in the 1st half to City Champion eventual Brother Rice. Mendel then proceeded to win their next 3 matches until once again they were stopped by the strong Brother Rice team.

In the City Championship meet, the Monarchs turned in superb performances as John Radavich clinched a 1st place slot in the heavyweight class and co-captain Pettenon gained 1st place honors in the 112 lb class. Greg Pettenon, Pat Taff, Mike Shehan, and Jim Wator took home 2nd place medals in the 98 lb, 138 lb, 185 lb, and 155 lb classes, respectively.














### Bowling



















#### Graduation


