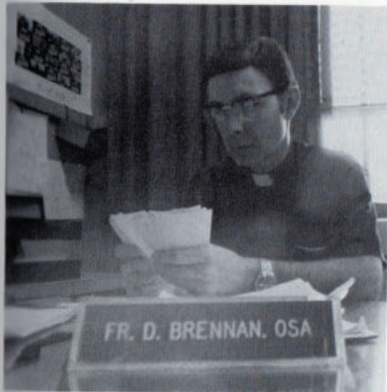


Change Highlights Administration

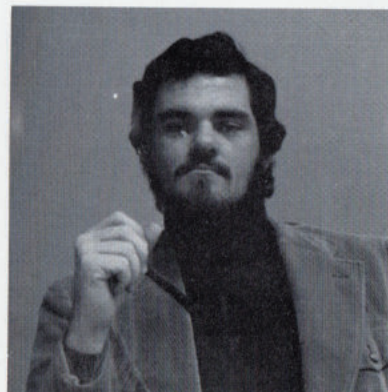
Fr. Thomas Martin O.S.A., is the Director of Religious Activities. His program of religious education includes class retreats and days of renewal.

Theology

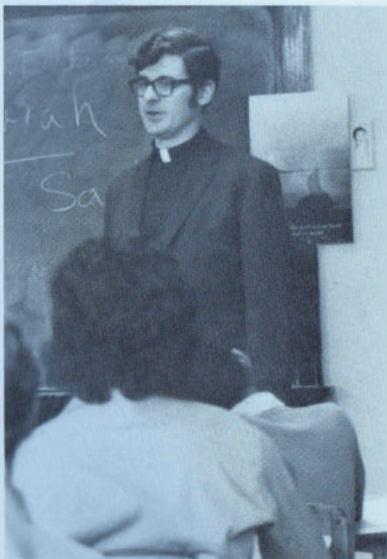

Languages

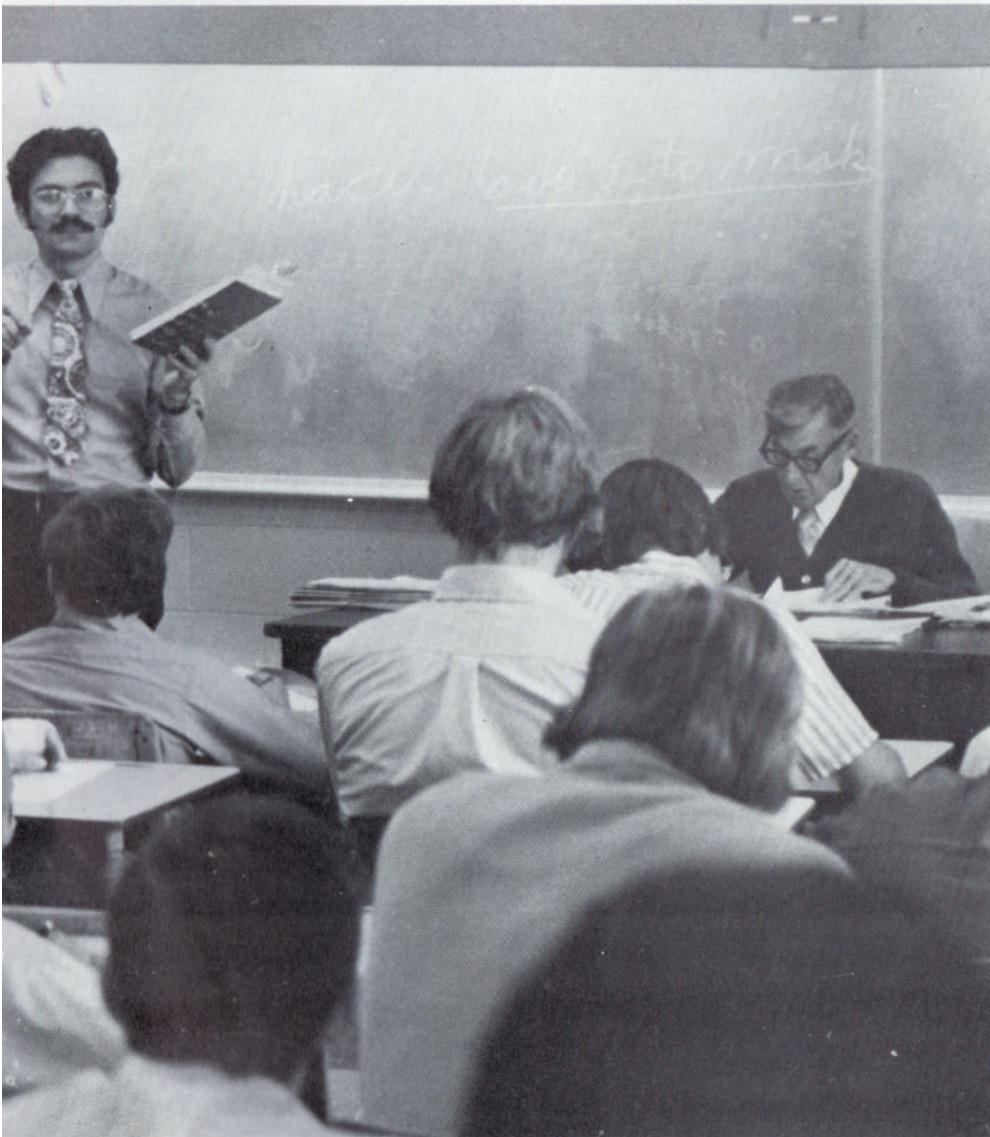

Though Mendel's gridders were off to a slow start with two early losses, they returned to humble several old arch-rivals.

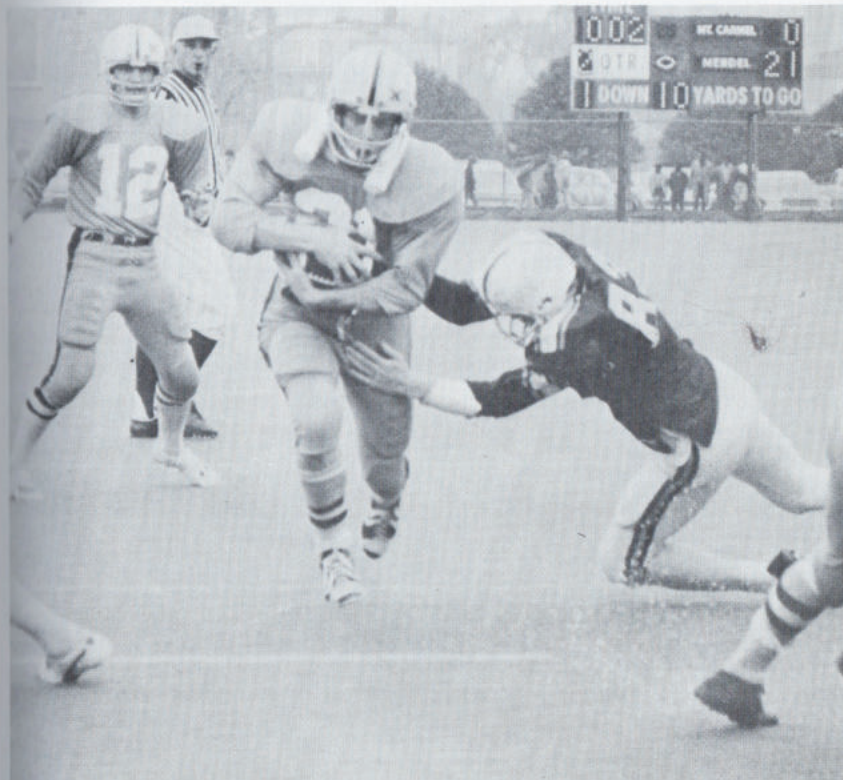
In a sweeping five game streak, the Monarchs clobbered Gordon Tech 15-0, St. Rita 21-0, Mr. Carmel 38-8, Leo 27-6, and St. Laurence 22-6, and finished the regular season with six wins and two losses.

Mendel faced St. Laurence in the playoff game. The Monarchs came off second best as the Vikings edged by with a 24-22 score.

Overall, however, Mendel placed second in the league and put a man on the All-State Team. Steve O'Grady, Monarch defensive tackle was honored at the All-State banquet in Campaign.

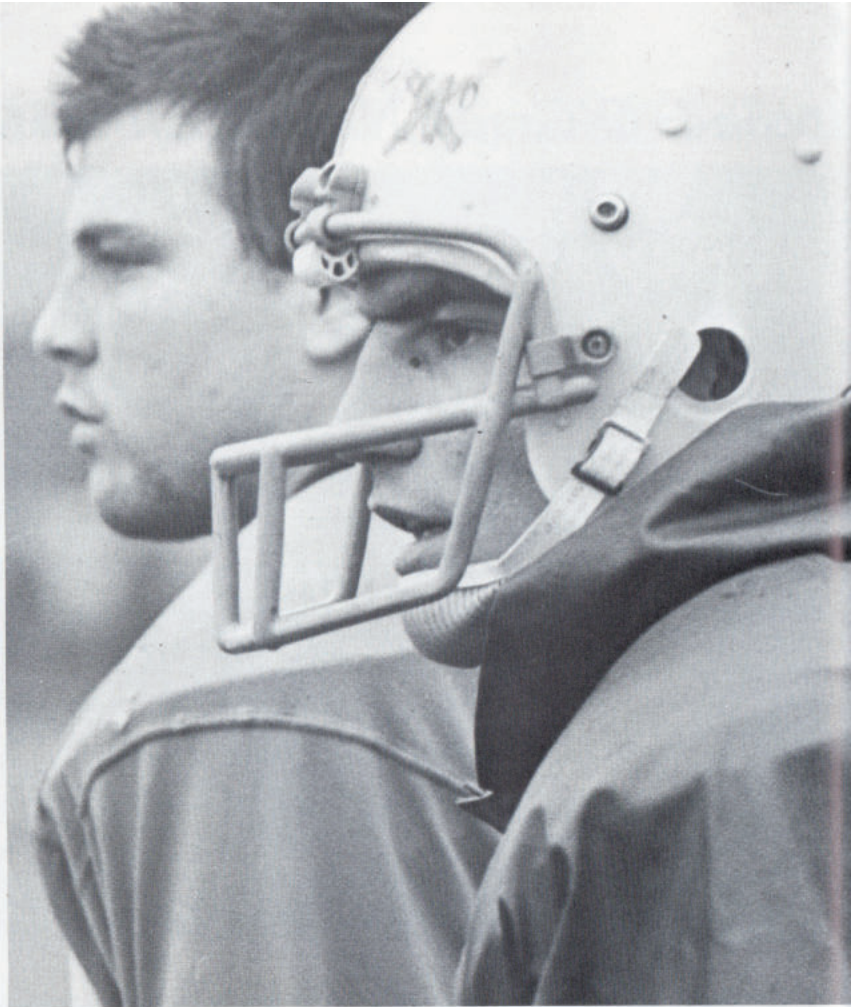


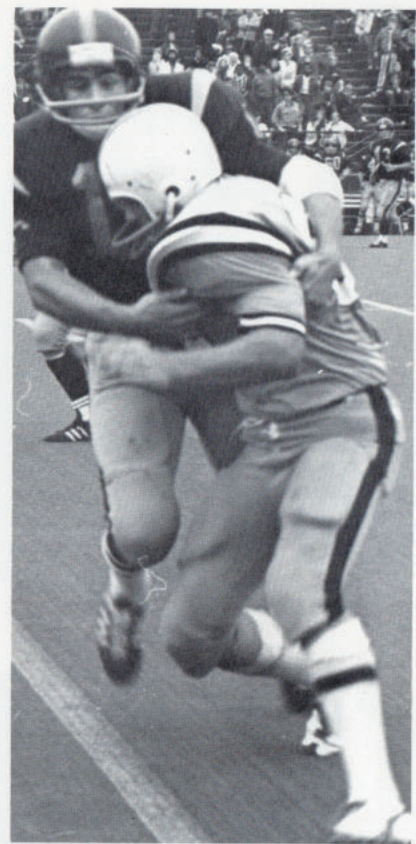

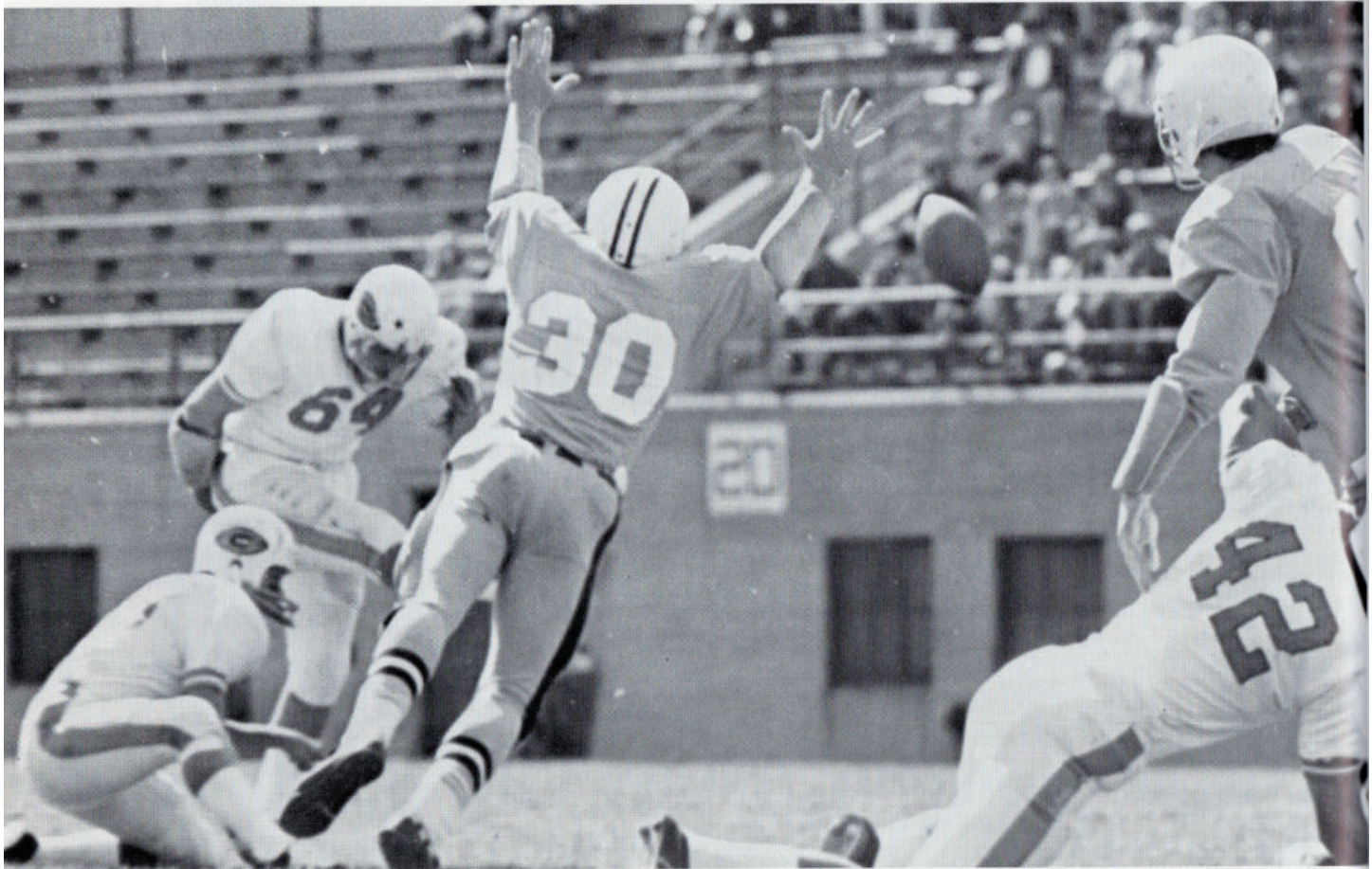

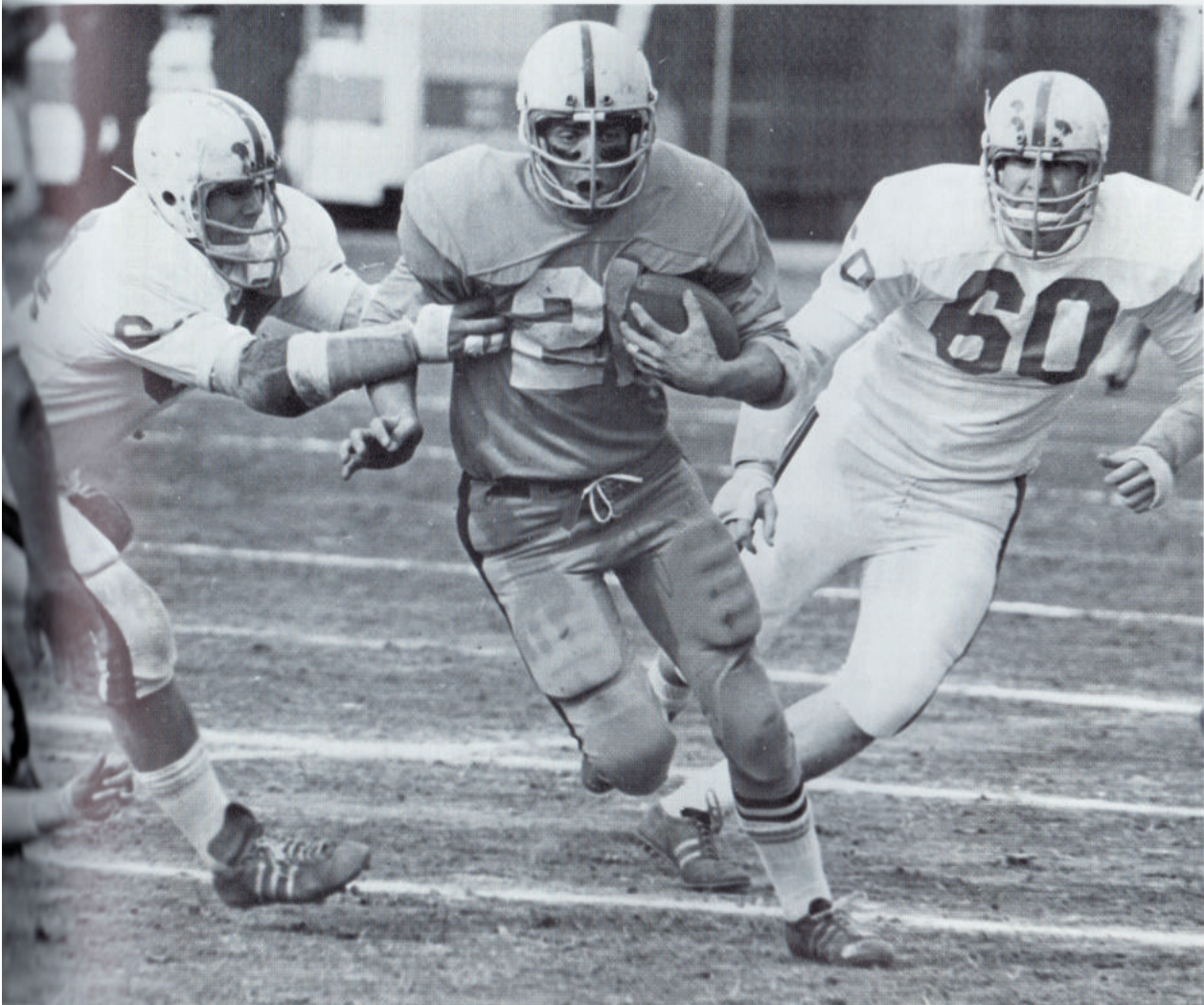

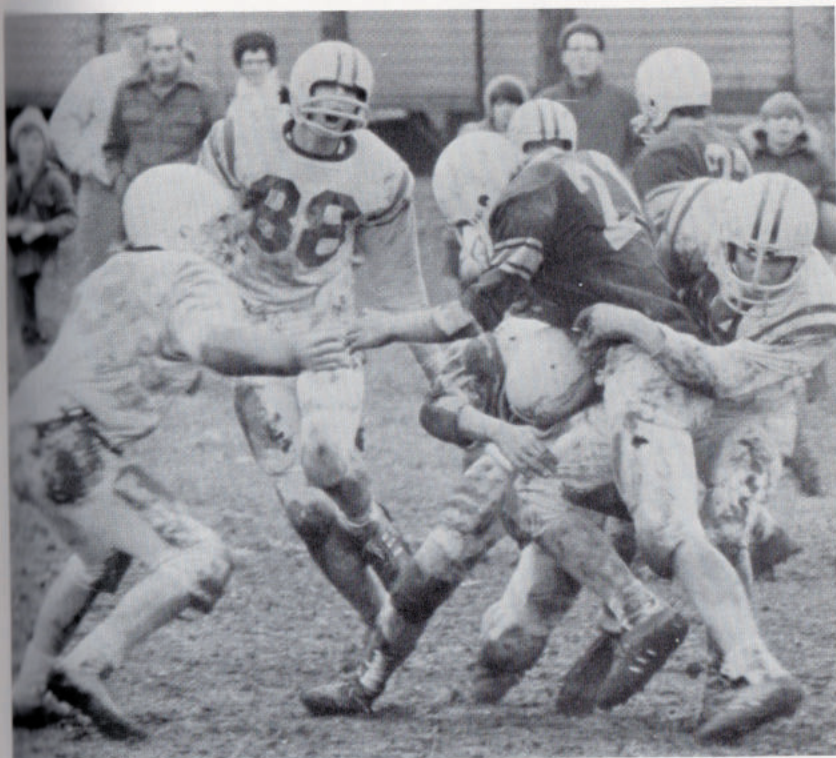

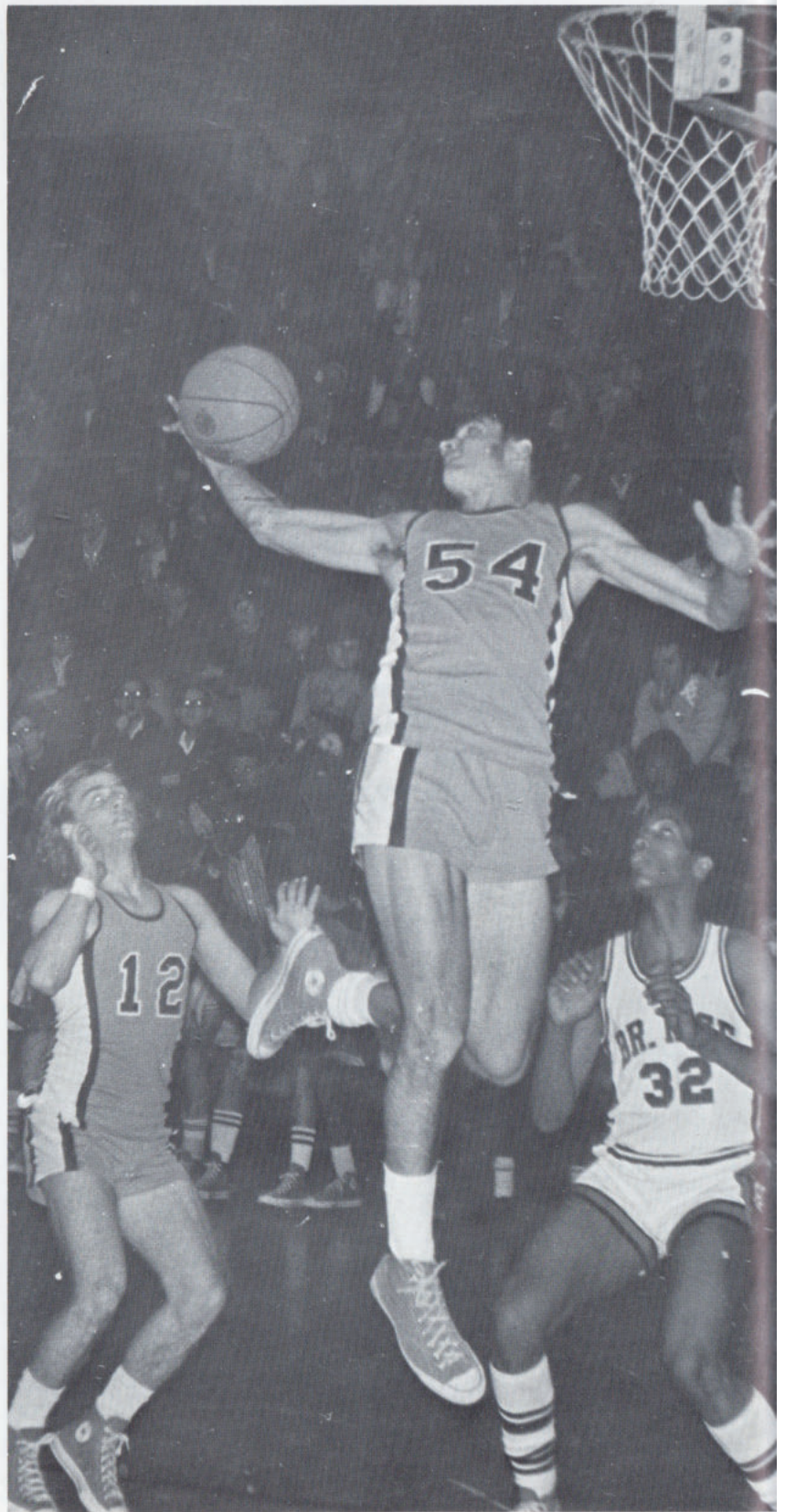

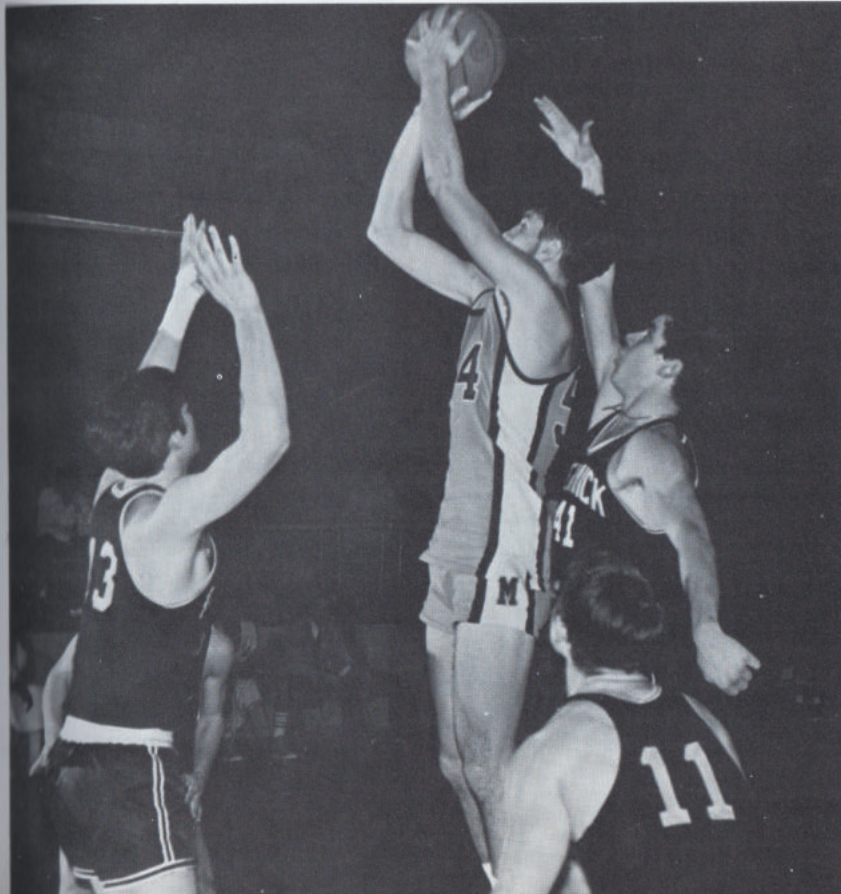
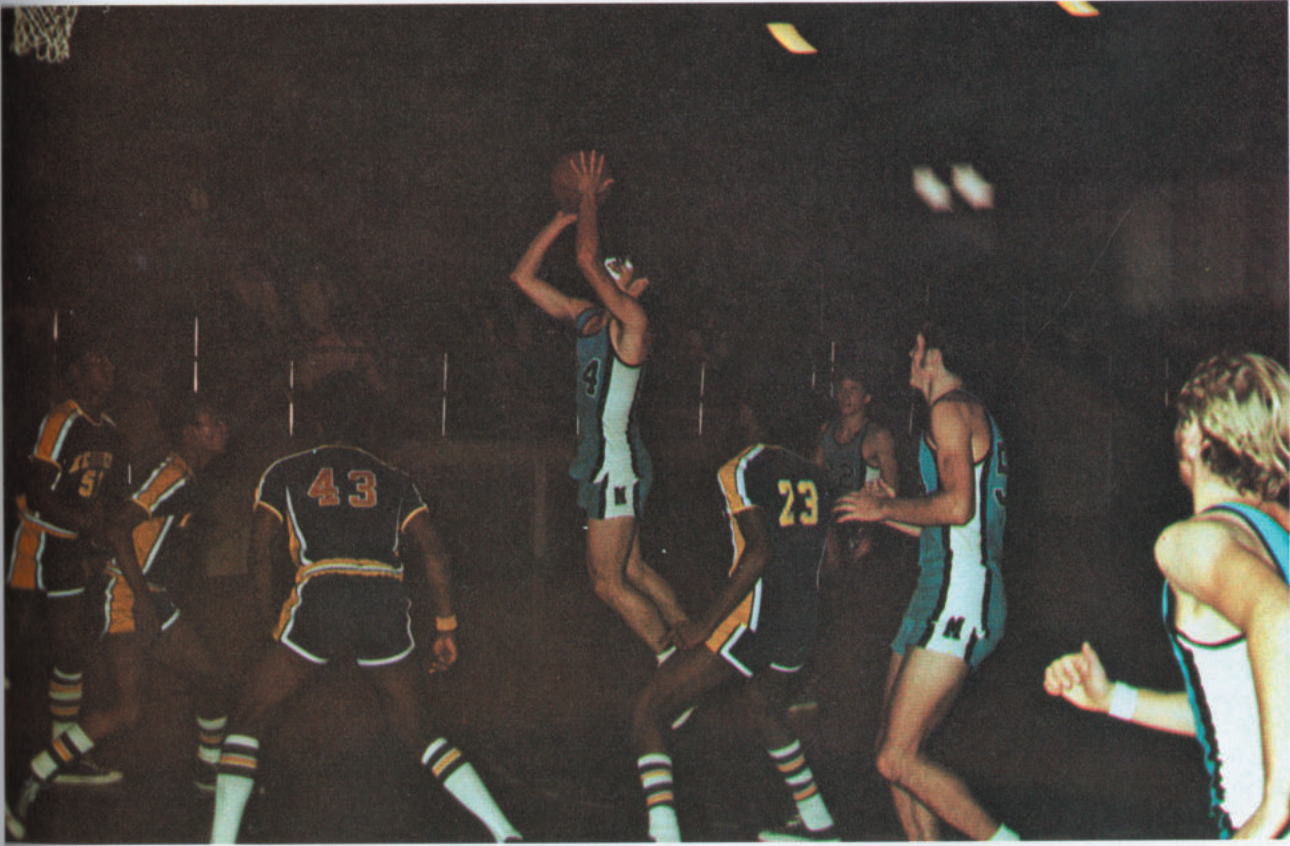
Basketball

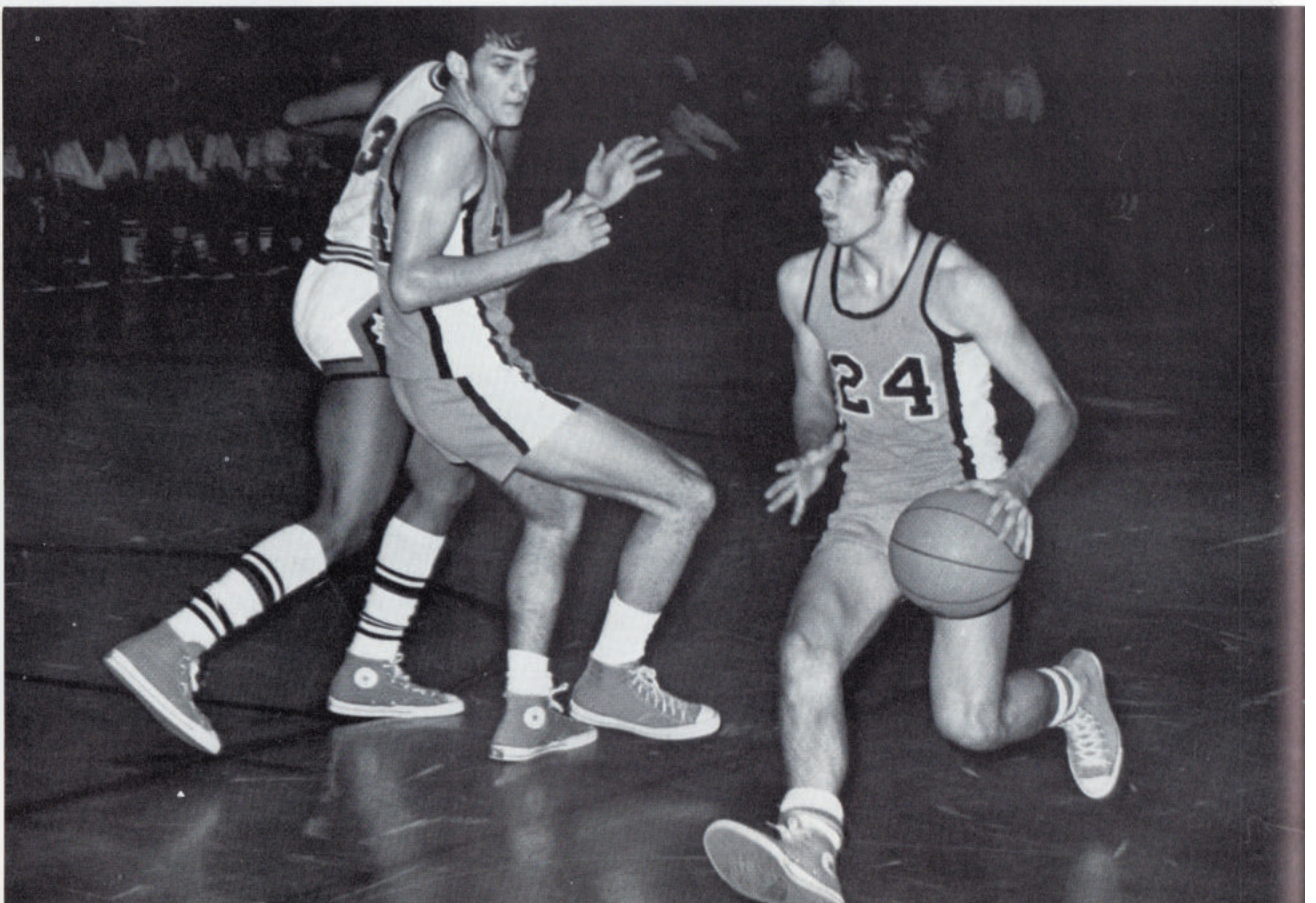

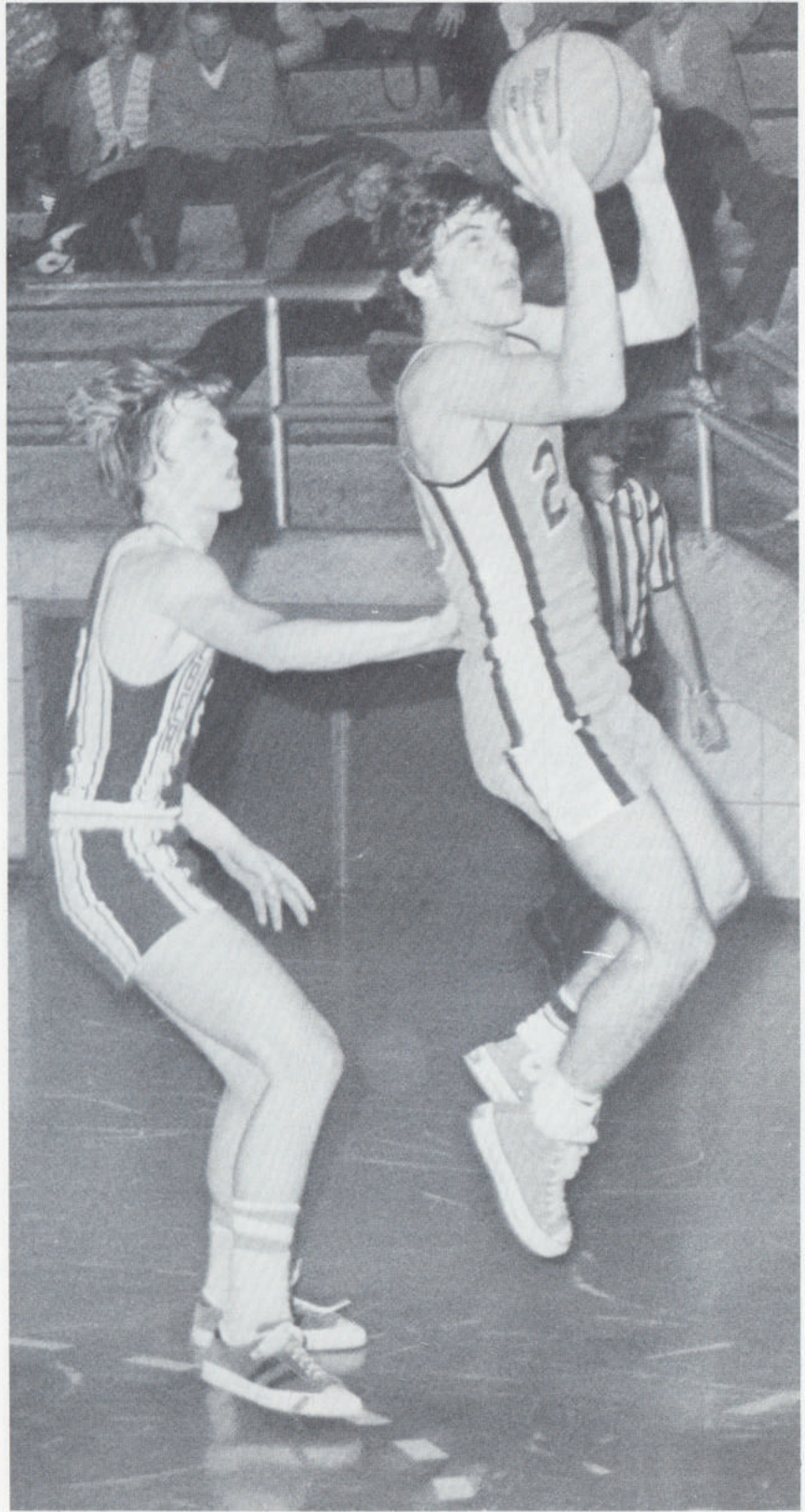
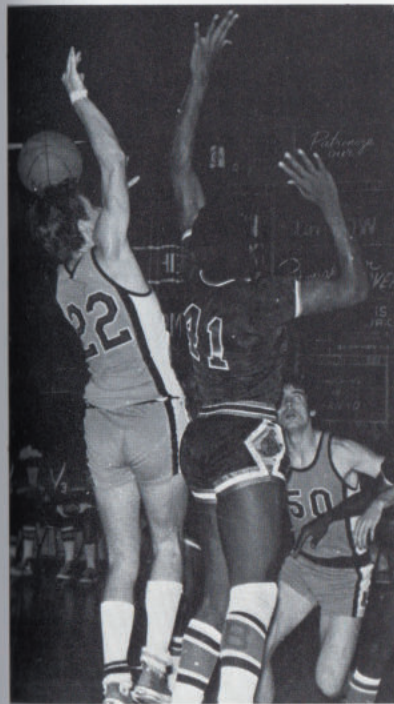

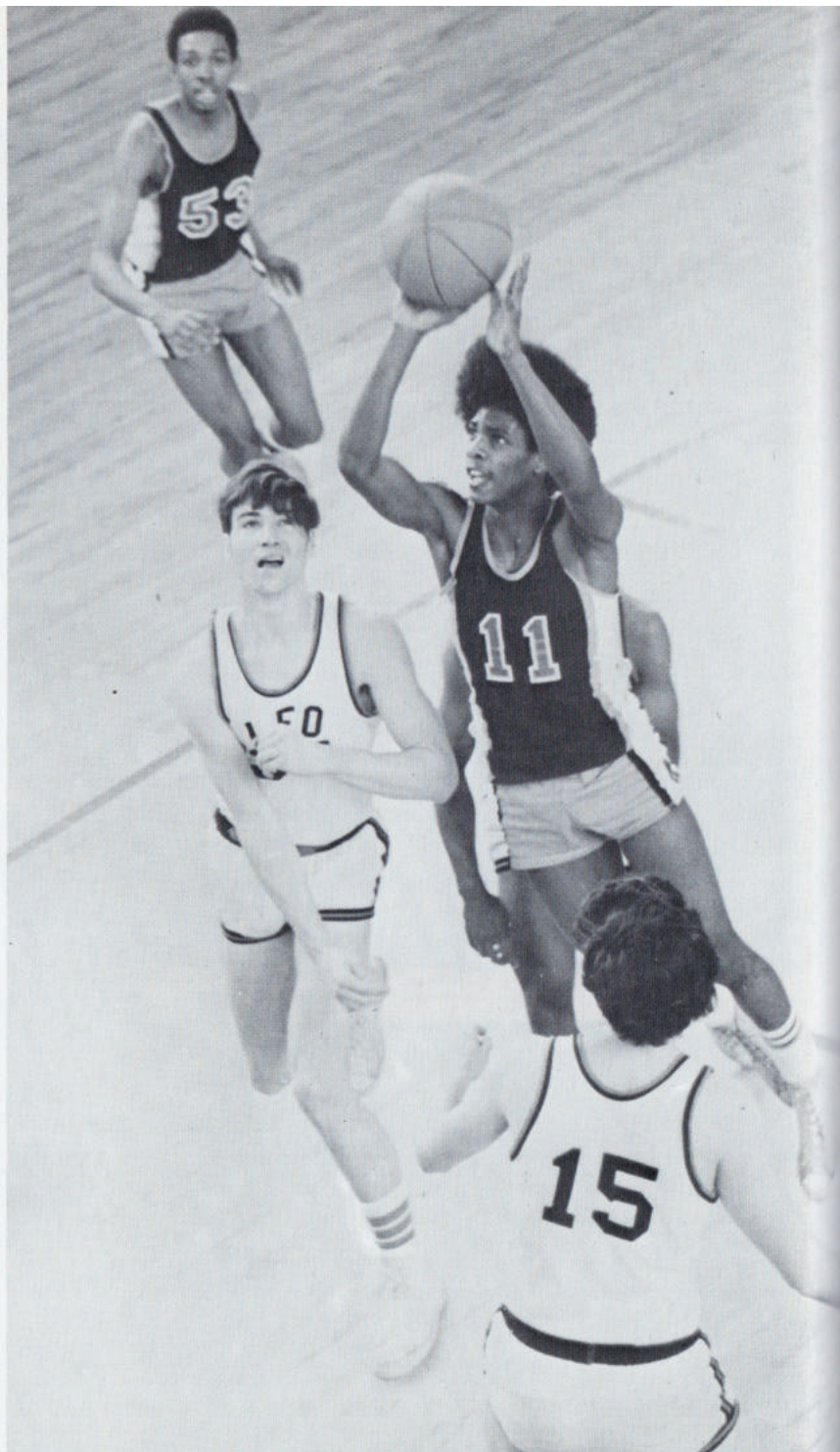


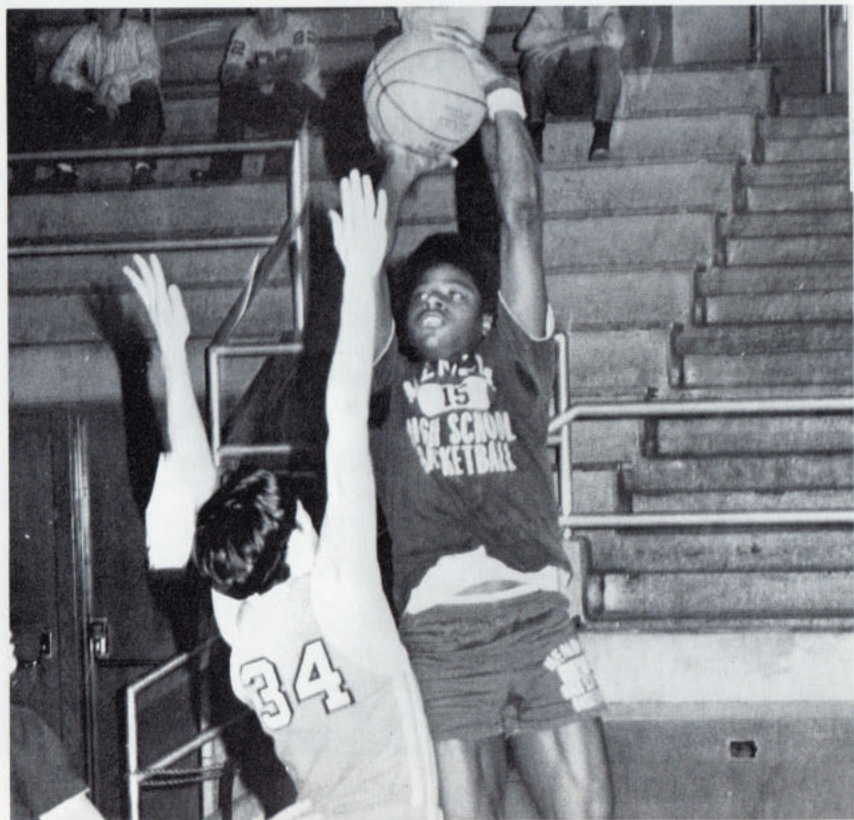
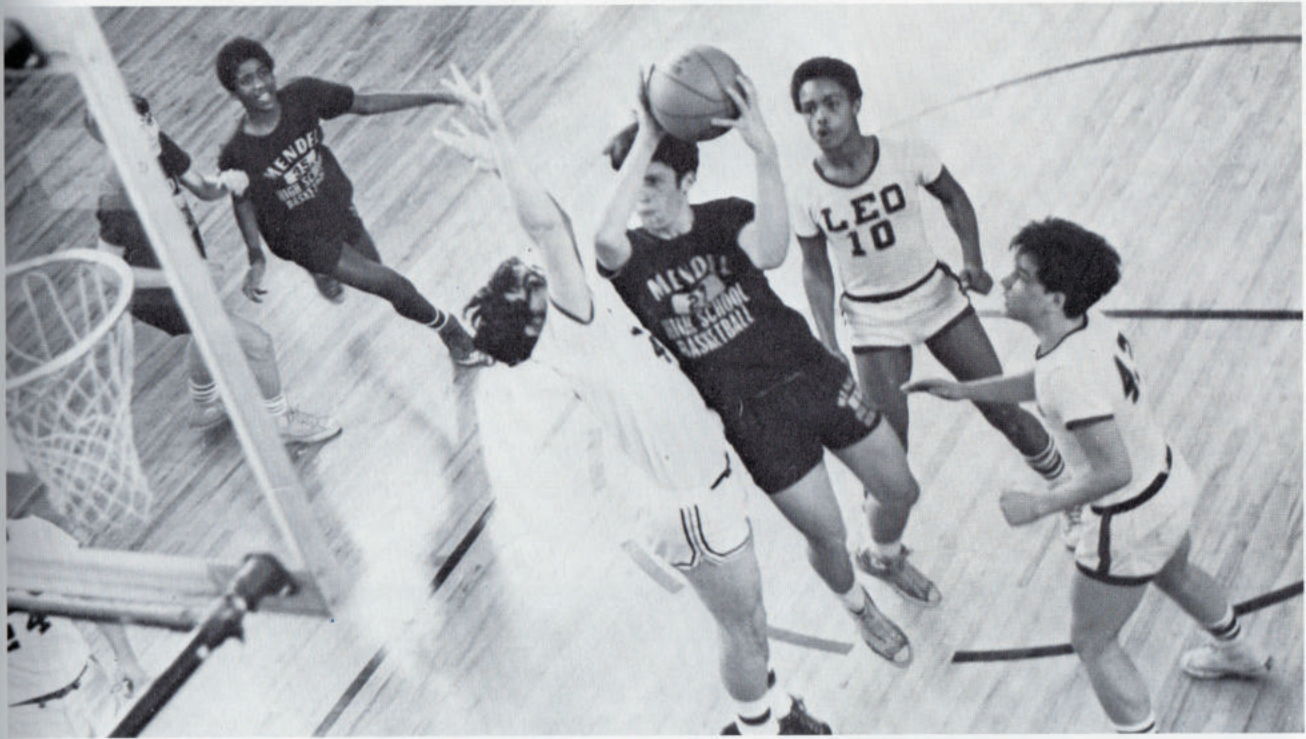
Fly-Bantam Basketball

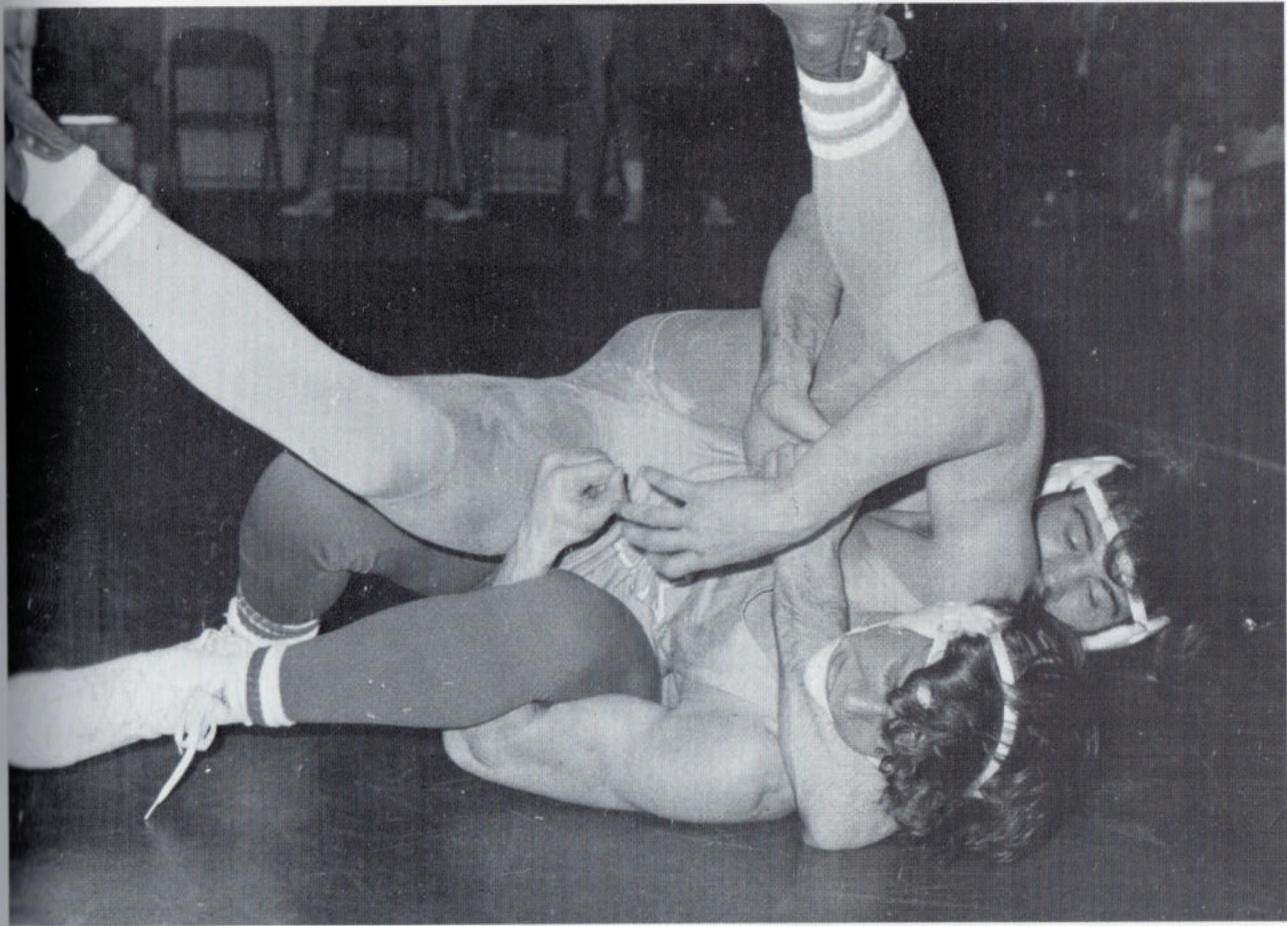

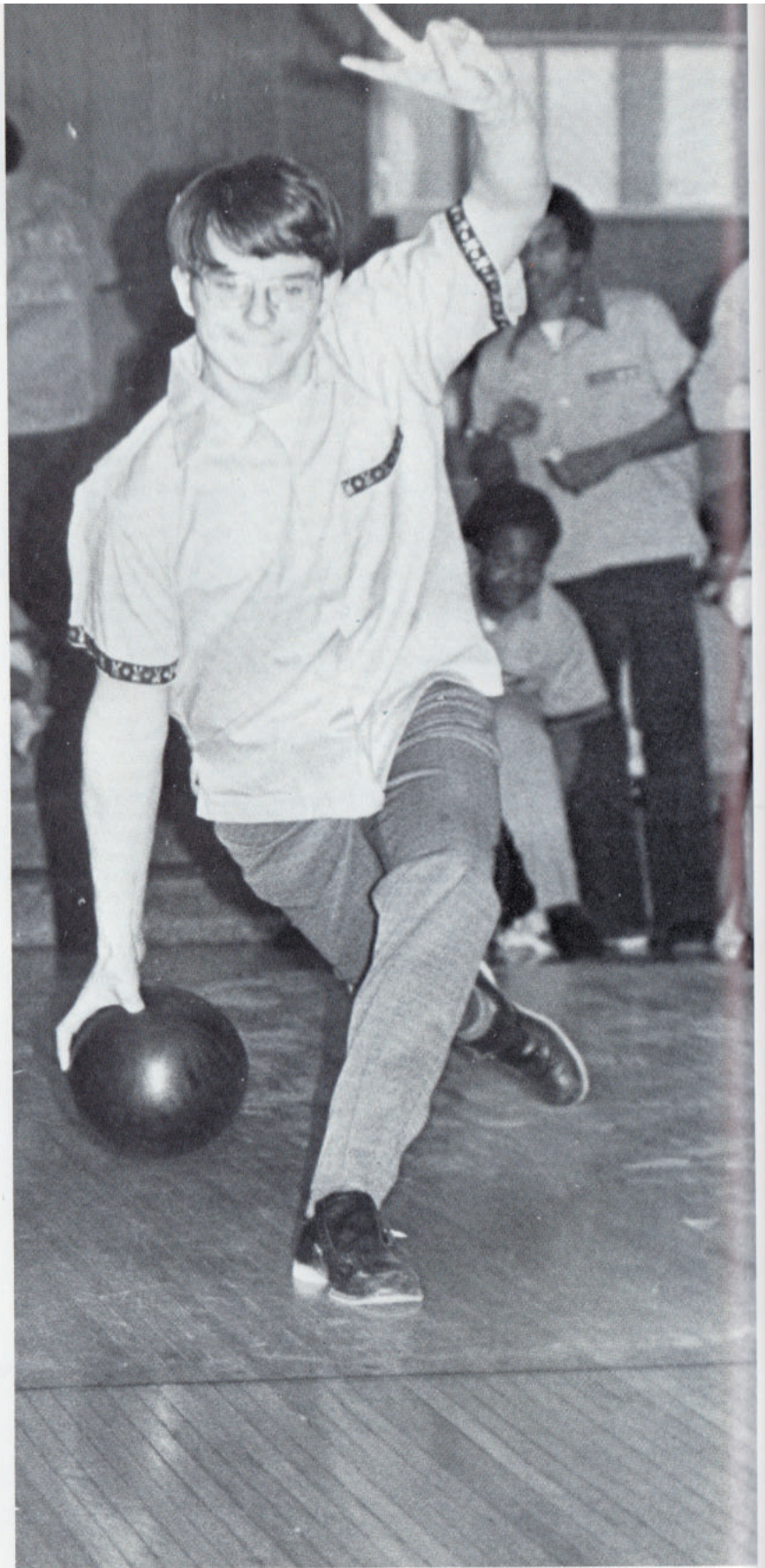
Bowling

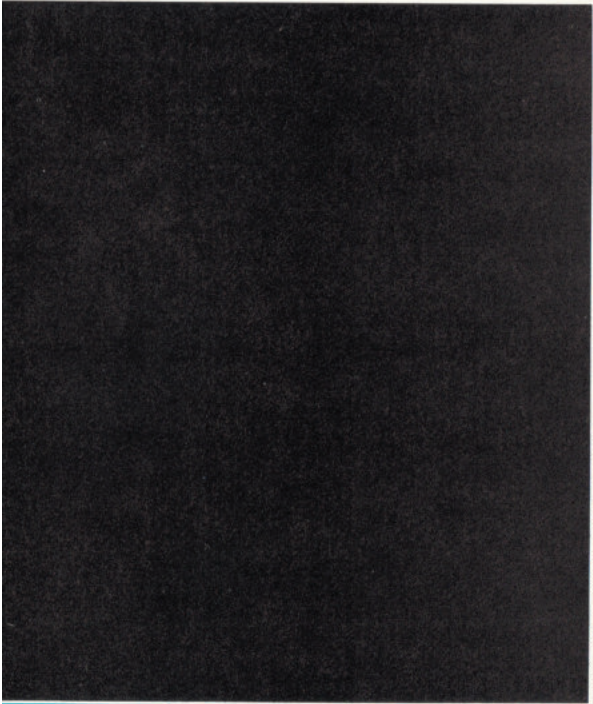

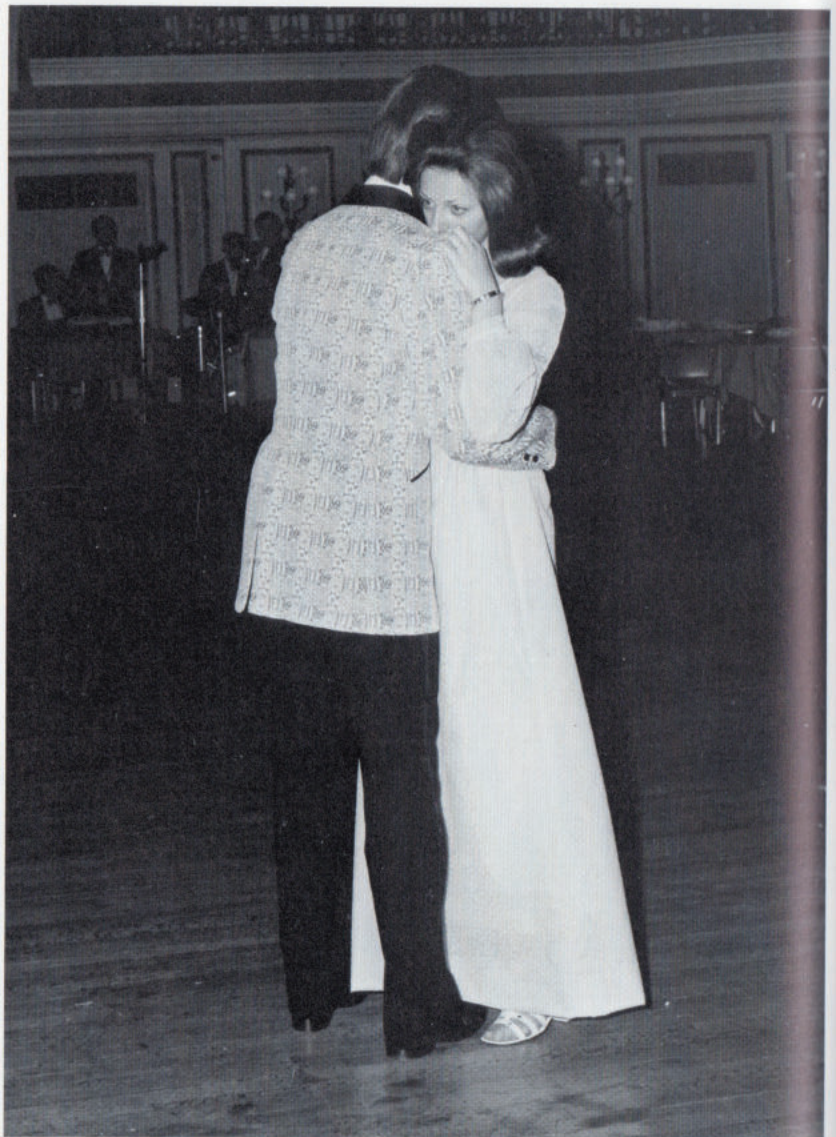

Senior Prom

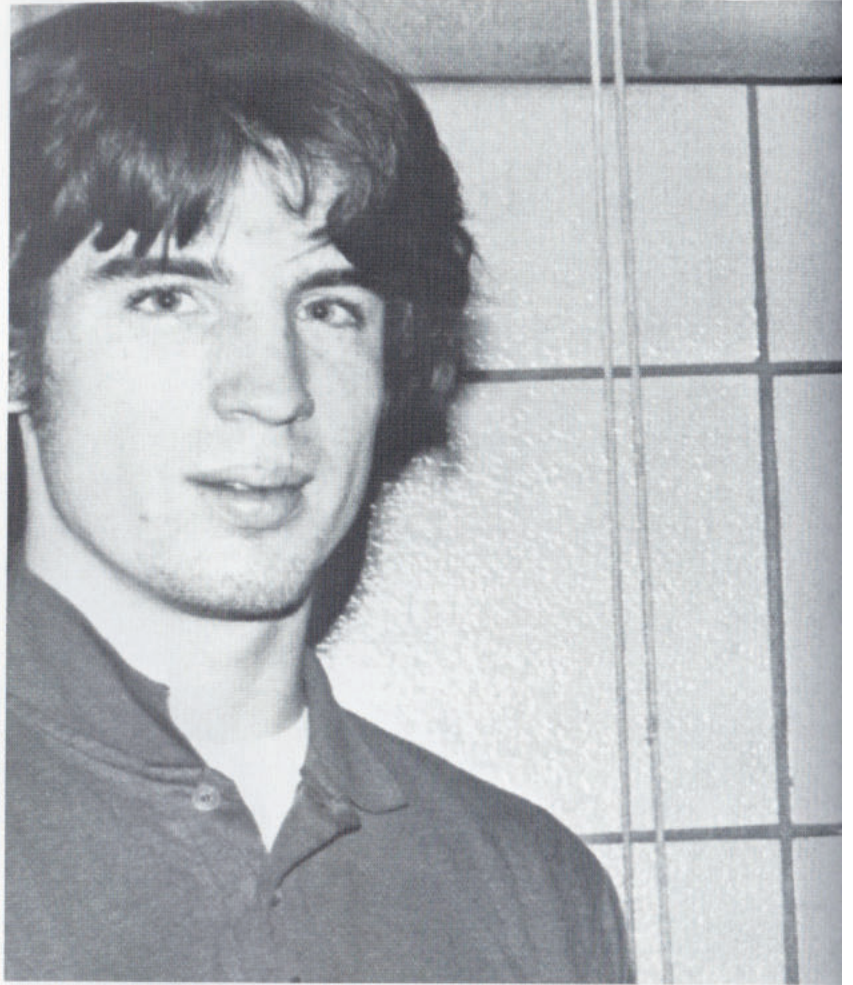

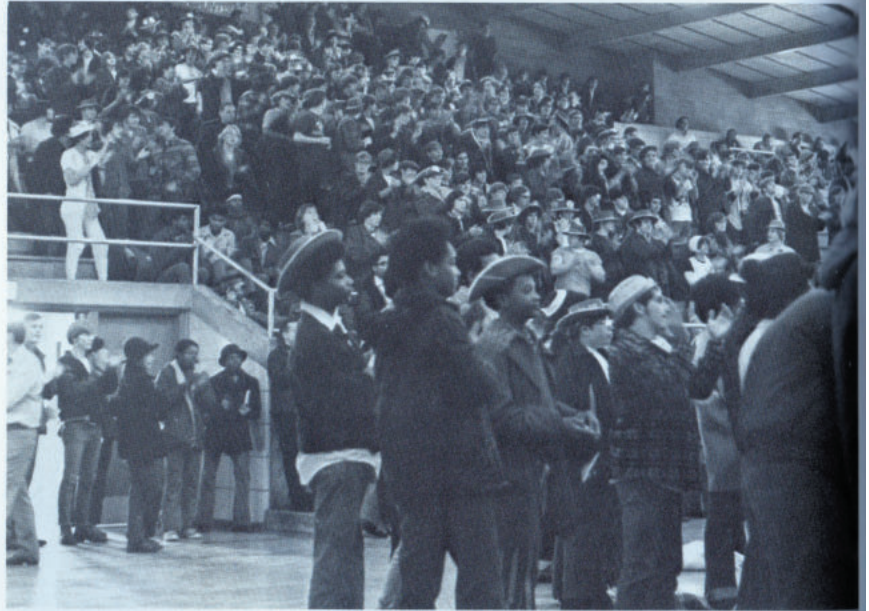

Graduation

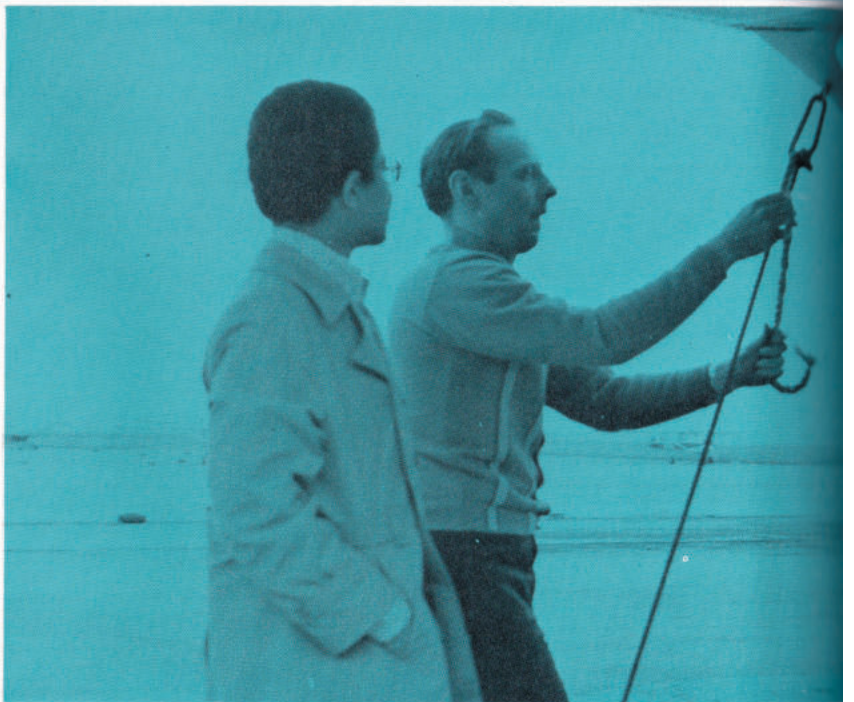
