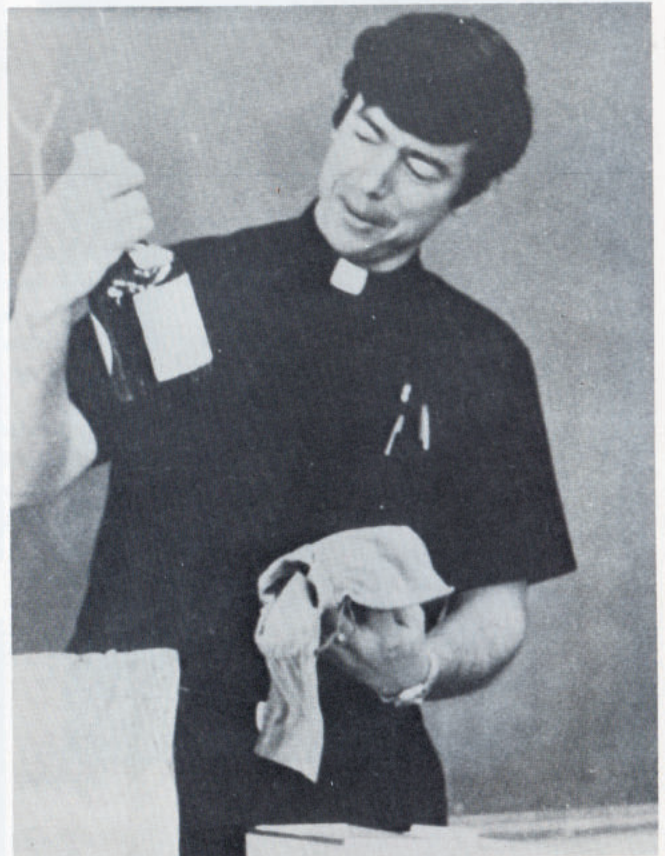


Dedication

Yet Mr. Guida was more than a coach. His dedication and love for Mendel has set an example for every member of the Mendel family.

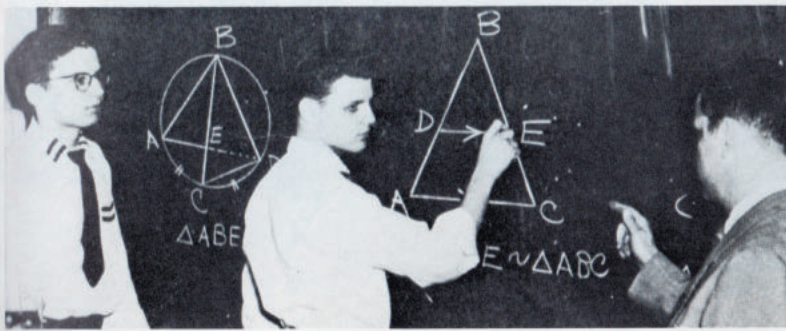

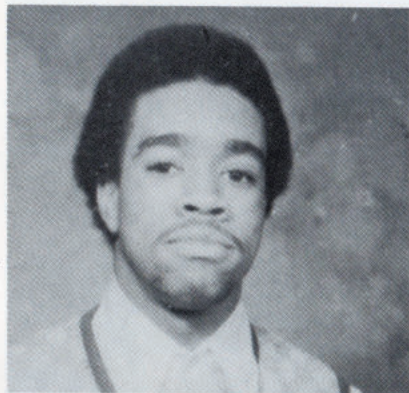
Monarch Varsity Basketball

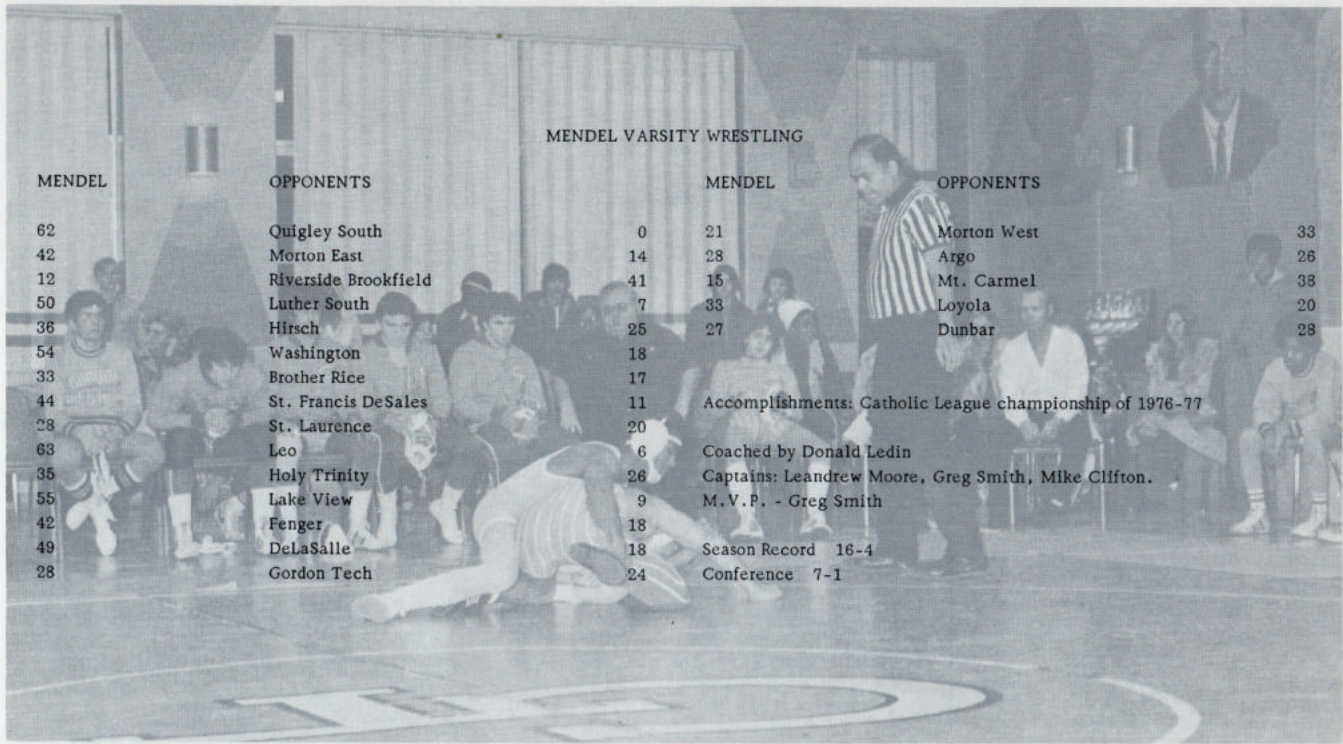
