










# Our Theme Gregor Mendel Science - Religion






## The Alumni Association



Our entire program of studies is so designed that it will meet the most stringent of college requirements, and provide a broad basic education to meet all his needs.


## Our Reading Course


## Religious Life



from the 2 to score. Jordan kicked the P.A.T.









went over from 5 yards out and Bob Napoli caught a pass from Jim Brennan for a T.D. Brennan lateralled


to Ed Bohan who threw a T.D. pass to Charlie Dreas. O'Brien scored again on a 65 yard run.

### MENDEL 19 - ST. GEORGE 13














