




FR. ALFRED BURKE, O.S.A.




FR. JOHN L. SEARY, O.S.A., PROVINCIAL






FR. JOHN C. McNABB, O.S.A. Vice Rector of Guidance and Activities












Articulation Day






South Section trophy—the result of teamwork.





Center: Extra point attempt fails amidst bevy of strewn Ignatius players.





Needing a victory or tie to cop the South Section championship, the favored Monarchs invaded the corral of the St. Rita Mustangs. The swimming team might have had a better chance on that day of an all-morning rain, which saw the players of both sides totally undistinguishable after five minutes of play. Andreotti broke away for an 89 yard touchdown in the second quarter, which was countered by a St. Rita tally in the third quarter. Heads were carried high on both sides as the teams emerged from the Mud Bowl that afternoon, with the Monarchs' unbeaten string intact and the South Section crown in their then-muddy grasp.

In the first game of the city championship play-off, Mendel drew St. George, third place winner of the North Section. Playing an unusually listless first half, the Blue and White found themselves trailing 14-8 at the half. Yet, the spirit of both Mendel and Coach Joe Magee brought them roaring from the intermission to take advantage of a detected defensive Dragon weakness and score two quick tallies to grab the lead 22-14. It was only in the final seconds of the game that Fate, so kind hitherto in so many ways to the Mageemen, struck the death knell in the form of a 35-yard desperation pass for a score. In the subsequent melee, St. George pushed across a two-point extra pointer, tying the score, and thereby winning the playoff on the total number of first downs. For the Monarchs it was another game without a loss, at least in score, but it brought down the curtain in heartache and tears to a team never given a chance at the outset of the season, but one that refused to quit!










