

AND WITH FIDELITY TO MY GOD, MY COUNTRY, AND MY FELLOW-MEN.


And my reply to you then and my prayer for you always is this . . .

Go you of Mendel, you have many other goals to attain. And you can do it.










In spite of the complications against me, as monarch Editor, was not about to give
